Dear Members and Friends,

As we enter the summer holiday season, many of you will be traveling. Others have responsibilities or circumstances that will keep you here in Cleveland County this summer. Wherever you are, I hope that you will keep first things first by making worship a priority. If you are out of town, try to find a church where you can worship. I always look forward to receiving bulletins that members bring back from their travels (especially with comments about what you find meaningful). If there is no church accessible, plan your own worship service. Read one of the Psalms such as Psalm 121 or 139 and reflect on God's goodness and love and the beauty of God's creation. If you need some worship resources, please check with me or Bonnie as you are planning your trip. We also want our homebound members to feel included. Call the church office to make sure you are on the list for homebound communion or to receive a copy of the weekly bulletin or a recording of a worship service.

Our summer worship schedule features a 10 a.m. service in the sanctuary preceded by summer Sunday school at 9 a.m. and followed by lemonade and fellowship in the courtyard. During the month of June, each Sunday service will include a brief time of faith-sharing by a member of the church about a time when God's presence was especially real. The sermons for June 5th, 12th, and 26th are based on questions that children have asked. On

Sunday, June 5th the subject is: *"Is Heaven for Real?"* The sermon that day will reference the best-selling book by Todd Burpo. On June 12th the subject is: *"Why Is Everybody Wearing Red Today?"* (Note: Please plan to wear something red that day!) On June 26th the subject is: *"Did John the Baptist Eat Real Grasshoppers?"*

I am looking forward to Father's Day, June 19th, when my father, the Rev. Martin L. Harkey, Jr. of Anderson, South Carolina, will be preaching at morning worship. Also, my mother, Lu Harkey, will be present after the service if anyone would like to talk with her about her new book of faith stories, *Prisms of Life: Experiences of God's Grace and Presence in Our Lives*.

Please keep Fran McSwain and the other members of the Presbytery Mission Team in your prayers as they travel to Guatemala June 1st through the 7th to visit sister churches. Fran will be the first person from our congregation to visit Las Animas since the town-wide water purification system was completed. We look forward to hearing from Fran after her return from southwestern Guatemala. Thank you to all who have given so generously of your time and money to help bring safe and abundant water to our sister church, Monte los Olivos, and the surrounding community.

SESSION MEETING NOTES

APRIL 19, 2011

The Session of Shelby Presbyterian Church met on Tuesday, April 19, 2011, at 7:00 p.m. in the back parlor at the church.

Elders present were Nancy Blackley, Robert Burns, Mary Conner, Robin Fichter, Richard Fletcher, Robin Holland, Chuck Lampley, Mimi Martin, Joe Miller, Ali Paksoy, John Schweppe III, Jeanne Spragins, and Larry Wilson. **Elder excused** was Joyce Boyette. **Elder absent** was Jack Breen.

Also present were Pastor Luke Harkey, Educator Bonnie Sanford, and Joe Ogburn, Dean of the College of Elders.

The session was called to order by Dr. Harkey after it was established that a quorum was present. Elder Robert Burns gave a devotional, followed by prayer.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Elder Larry Wilson reminded the session of the Officers' breakfast on Saturday, April 30, 2011, at 8:30 a.m. It will be held at the Wilsons' home. An email will be sent to all officers giving directions to the home.

Elder Richard Fletcher announced that Presbytery will meet Tuesday, April 26, 2011, at Montreat. Issues to be discussed and voted upon are the adoption of the Belhar Confession and the proposed new Form of Government. Our church will be represented by Dr. Harkey and Elders Richard Fletcher and Jeanne Spragins.

MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING: A motion was made, seconded and approved that the minutes of the Stated Session meeting on March 22, 2011 be approved.

COMMITTEES:

FINANCE: Elder Robert Burns said that the Finance Committee had met to discuss the funding necessary to make needed repairs to the church property. Motion was made that representatives of the committee be given permission to talk with local bankers for informational purposes regarding a possible loan. The motion was seconded and approved.

FAITH AND HEALTH: Educator Bonnie Sanford reported that the committee is exploring the possibility of a bone marrow drive on behalf of Sloan Chambers. The session asked for further information

on what is involved regarding such a drive and the fundraising necessary to implement it. This will be discussed again at the Stated Session meeting in May.

MISSION AND MINISTRY: Elder John Schweppe III reminded the session that Fran McSwain will represent our church on a Presbytery mission trip to Guatemala June 1-7, 2011. In the past our church has helped to offset the cost of such trips. It was recommended that SPC pay \$700, the amount remaining in the Guatemala Water Mission Fund. This was approved by the session.

SPIRITUAL LIFE: Elder Mary Conner informed the session that Prayer Trios would begin on Sunday, May 1, 2011, and continue until the end of July. She encouraged officers to participate.

ORDER OF THE DAY: PERSONNEL/FILLING A STAFF VACANCY: Elder Joe Miller distributed forms for perusal and discussion regarding the status of present church programs and the various needs of our church which should be addressed. The session talked at length about where we are as a congregation and what direction we need to take in order to strengthen our church.

NEW BUSINESS: It was announced that the weekend of January 20-22, 2012, is available at Montreat for the annual Officers' Retreat. It was decided to keep the first weekend of January for the retreat and be on a waiting list for the second or fourth weekends.

Dr. Harkey closed the meeting with a benediction.
