Dear Members and Friends,

April 1st this year is Easter Sunday. This is the centerpiece of our faith, the celebration of the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. I invite you to join with us for morning worship with three services at 7 a.m., 8:30 a.m., and 11 a.m.

We welcome members from Central United Methodist and First Baptist to the Easter Sunrise service in the courtyard. Bring flowers for the flower cross in front of the sanctuary. Also, remember to bring folding chairs or plan to use those provided by the church. This Easter the Rev. Mark Barden, pastor of Central UMC will be preaching. At the conclusion of the service we will gather before the flower cross against the backdrop of the eastern horizon. After the service everyone is invited to Ellis Hall for coffee, juice, traditional hot cross buns, and a time of fellowship.

The 8:30 and 11 a.m. services will be held in the sanctuary surrounded by Easter lilies and special music by our Chancel Choir. The sermon entitled "Christ, the Power of God" is based on I Corinthians 1.18-25, and 2.1-5. Join us as we sing praises to God and give thanks for new life in Christ.

People are still talking about the Youth Sunday service on March 18th. What an inspiration! It is so heart-warming to see how young people have been nurtured by this church family, to witness how their faith in Jesus Christ has become real and alive, and to see the gratitude that they have for their families, their youth group, and their church family. Each time we as a congregation take part in a service

of baptism we promise to pray for and teach and encourage our children and youth. As one of our parents said after the Youth Sunday service, "*I am so grateful that members of our church have stepped up to the plate to serve as youth advisors, Sunday school teachers, Confirmation sponsors, and Scout leaders, and taken a genuine interest in our children!*" A CD disk recording of the Youth Sunday service can be ordered by contacting Jane in the church office or by checking the Shelby Presbyterian Church website at www.shelbypres.org.

On April 15th there will be a special Sunday afternoon communion service in the sanctuary designed for members who are not usually able to attend Sunday morning worship. This service, sponsored by the Member Care Committee, is open to all our members and will be followed by a reception in Ellis Hall. Please contact Margie McSwain if you have any questions.

One final note: be sure to see the article about Jane Szymborski's impending retirement at the end of September and the save the date reminder for Sunday, September 23rd. It is difficult to imagine Shelby Presbyterian Church without Jane. Please plan to join us as we express our gratitude to Jane for 40 years of service (as of May 1st) to this church and ask God's blessing on Jane and Paul as they enter this next chapter in their lives.

ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

Have you ever

taught a child to hold their fingers inside their hands and say the rhyme, "here is the church, here is the steeple, open the doors and see all the people?" The wiggling fingers teach children, and adults, too, that the church is not the building – the steeples, windows, or structure – but people gathering to worship God.

There's something else in the children's rhyme. As the child breaks open their hands to reveal the people, they move their fingers back and forth, often as fast as they can. This simple move reminds us that the church is the energy and actions that share the love of Christ.

- When disaster strikes, people give, volunteer, and pray so that those impacted receive help and hope, **this is church.**
- When poverty and violence cause hunger and people join together to respond to the need and address its root causes, **this is church.**

SESSION MEETING NOTES

FEBRUARY 20, 2018

Doug Boyette reported that the Safety and Security Task Force is on track and will begin to have regular meetings to discuss ways to improve the security of the church. He also recommended recruiting people with medical skills from the congregation who would be able to respond to an emergency in the church, should it arise, as well as training in general for the defibrillators stationed around the church.

Lionel and Jill Dodson requested transfer to Winter Park Presbyterian in Wilmington, NC. Annelle Kelly requested transfer to First Presbyterian in Gastonia, NC. Both requests were approved.

Paul Woodard requested that officers complete and return the evaluation forms from the January retreat.

Agaat Den Hertog reported on the January 27 Presbytery meeting.

Spencer Borders reported that the first 2018 Diaconate meeting went well.

Luke Harkey reported that the February 20 blood drive produced 33 units. Also, the playground has been deeded to the church from the current owners. Dr. David Hosick has been named as the PneuMatrix coach for SPC.

The minutes from the January 16, 2018 Stated Session Meeting were approved.

Brock Taylor reported that communion would be served by intinction on Maundy Thursday and by serving on Easter Sunday. He asked for officers to sign up to serve on Easter.

Robin Holland (Fellowship Committee) reported that a church retreat has been scheduled at Montreat on August 18. Also, she recommended that once a month any money collected over the expense of the Wednesday night meals be accumulated through the spring and donated to the Walter and

Florence Perry Scholarship; and money collected over expenses in the fall go toward the Guatemala Scholarship Fund. This recommendation was approved.

Margie McSwain (Member Care) explained the homebound communion procedure and asked that officers sign up to serve. She gave a brief report on Al Sproull's spiritual counseling program.

Paul Woodard (Mission & Ministry) recommended that \$1500.00 be donated to the Good Samaritan Clinic in the Dominican Republic. This recommendation was approved. Also, a recommendation was made to allocate \$250.00 to Dr. Martha Sommers to help offset her travel expense in visiting SPC and a Wednesday night program. This recommendation was approved. Finally, a recommendation was made to allocate \$500.00 in order to sponsor a table at the March 16 Cleveland County Rescue Mission Banquet/Fundraiser. This recommendation was approved in principal. Jill Venable recommended that Missions use existing budgeted money to fund this request until Finance could meet and discuss the request.

Jeanne Spragins (Worship & Music) recommended that the 2018 Christmas Eve service be moved from 8:00 PM back to 11:00 PM. This recommendation was approved. She also reported that Worship and Music had approved the use of the Sanctuary for the June 23, 2018 wedding of David Blackley and Brie Hawley.

Jeff Hamilton reported that he would have the information from the recent church survey available at the next Session meeting.

Jeff also reported on the kickoff meeting of the PneuMatrix program and expects meetings of the group within SPC will begin in the near future.

Luke Harkey reported that the Presbytery has received the grant request to allocate \$1000 to sponsor the Water to Wine program.

Doug Boyette reported that the Stephen Ministry at SPC will become inactive.

Lloyd Williams reported that the Safety and Security Task Force has met and begun the process of reviewing the SPC security needs.

Consider the need for a "children's education worker," similar to the youth intern, to help coordinate children's activities and diversity.

Create a Coordinating Council consisting of the Clerk, Vice-Clerk, Pastor, and members of Session to discuss ways to improve diversity, inclusion, and tolerance within SPC.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer.
