Dear Members and Friends,

With many of you, I am looking forward to hearing our newly renovated and enhanced pipe organ. Final preparations are underway including voicing each pipe and making sure the pipes and digital enhancements are properly balanced. The organ will have much greater capability with a wider variety of sounds and textures. There will also be more control over volume levels from very soft to full, but not overpowering sound.

What can you expect to see? The pipes and organ console are back in place. One difference is the location of the organ console - on the opposite side of the chancel. Because the console will be a little higher and not blocked by the pulpit, the sight lines will be much better. This will be helpful when the offering is being received, when communion is being served, and during weddings, when the bride and wedding party are entering the sanctuary. With the relocation of the console, there will now be sufficient space to add a grand piano at some point.

One thing you cannot see is the newly rebuilt room that houses the pipes. The old room was constructed of quarter-inch plywood. The new material is much thicker and will reflect more of the sound of the pipes into the sanctuary. Special thanks to Warren Julian for his oversight on this project.

The addition of digital effects will create an antiphonal effect that will better support congregational singing. The sound of the organ will be fuller without necessarily being louder. One of the new features of our organ is a solo trumpet and

trumpet section. It has also been possible to re-purpose some of the pipes to create a flute section!

To quote Jim Twyne from the Zimmer Organ Company, *"The organ has been brought up-to-date, and readied to serve Shelby Presbyterian Church for decades to come."*

Thanks to James Baird whose gift to the Organ Fund in memory of his sister, Martha Baird Blackley, set this exciting project in motion. Special thanks also to Cornell Zimmer, Aaron Pannebaker and their team, Joy Cushman and our Worship and Music Committee, Paul Woodard, Sandy Breneman, John Schweppe Jr. and all who have helped make this project possible through your gifts, your prayers, and your encouragement.

SESSION/DIACONATE JOINT MEETING NOTES

APRIL 17, 2018

Luke announced that the Water-to-Wine grant has been awarded and a team will be organized to proceed.

Lloyd Williams reported that the Security and Safety Task Force is using the Waldensian Presbyterian Church security & safety program as a guide in preparing our security & safety plan. Shelby Police Department will meet soon with the task force.

The officer retreat for 2019 will be held at Shelby Mission Camp on Saturday, January 12, 2019 (inclement weather back up will be Feb. 2).

Luke discussed his trip to the Holy Land on April 27-May 7. He presented pastoral care plans for his absence. First response is to use neighborhood groups. Pastors who have agreed to assist if needed are Rev. Bill Lowe, Rev. Joan Martin and Rev. Len Byers. Luke gave a list of contact information to all present. During his absence Rev. Joan Martin and Rev. Len Byers will preach. There will be a possible trip to the Holy Land on May 18-27, 2019. Luke will advise after his trip whether he will recommend it.

Robin Holland reported plans for Jane Szymborski's retirement celebration. It will be held after Worship on Sept. 23. A planning committee has been formed. Members are Robin Holland, Debbie Ferrell, Stuart Schweppe, Peggy Paksoy and Ellen Fletcher.

Spencer Borders asked about progress on organ renovation. Luke said that good progress is

being made, but no date for completion has yet been announced.

Luke reported that a suggestion has been made that we make a plan for a medical emergency such as Amy Allen's fall on Sunday, April 15.

Betsy Fonvielle reported that a Compassion, Peace and Justice task force has been formed in order to promote diversity and inclusion at the church.

Robin Holland encouraged all to attend the Church retreat at Montreat in August.

Luke reported that the blood drive on Tuesday, April 17, collected 33 units. The goal was 36 units.

Janie Brownlee, sponsor: Susan Bell was unable to attend and will be examined on Sunday, April 22, at 10:30 in the Chapel during a called meeting of the Session.

Confirmands were introduced by their sponsors and each gave a brief statement about their experience during Confirmation classes. Sydney Davis also spoke about the confirmands and how seriously they took the classes and are assets to our Church. Confirmands were questioned. Luke offered a prayer and all extended congratulations and fellowship. Confirmands will be presented to the Congregation on Sunday, April, 22, 2018 by Sydney Davis.

SESSION MEETING NOTES APRIL 17, 2018

A separate Session Meeting followed joint Session/Diaconate Meeting.

Paul Woodard reported that Jenny Dickson has asked to transfer her membership to St. Paul Episcopal Church in Fort Mill, SC. Approved.

Paul read a note of thanks from the Presbytery Mission Committee thanking Shelby Presbyterian for its support of missionaries Jo Ella Holman, John McCall and Martha Sommers.

A motion was made to form a Compassion, Peace and Justice Task Force to pursue tolerance, inclusiveness and diversity for our Church. Motion passed.

A motion was made to form a Task Force to

assess the needs of younger adult members, singles and families with children in an effort to better meet their needs. Motion passed.

Luke reported that the blood drive on Tuesday, April 17, collected 33 units. The goal was 36 units.

Luke said that a job description for Church secretary would be included in the May newsletter and encouraged all to think of possible candidates.

Finance recommended that \$1500 be paid to the Good Samaritan Clinic in the Dominican Republic from the LeGrand Fund. Approved.

An update on the church survey was postponed until the next meeting.

Luke recommended that a Session Resolution of Thanks be written to Jim Perry for his scholarship gift to the Church. The Clerk, Vice-clerk and Pastor will come up with the wording. Graduates receiving the scholarship will submit a one page application.

Luke asked members of the Session to encourage members to participate in faith-sharing during the summer services.

PRESBYTERY IN BRIEF April 24, 2018

The Presbytery of Western North Carolina continues to be very attractive for many ministers! No fewer than TEN were welcomed and introduced by John Pea, chair of the Committee on Ministry, at Presbytery's meeting on Tuesday, April 24. Two came as pastors for congregations: David Bonnema for the Unity church in Denver; and David Roquemore for the Newton church. Two came for specialized ministries: Clay Fouse (whose parents, Clarence and Margaret, are well known here) as chaplain at the Charles George Veterans Administration in Asheville; and Daniel Tipton as chaplain at the Four Seasons Compassion for Life Hospice in Hendersonville. David Cameron came as a member-at-large (a status pending future service), whose wife Kathryn is the pastor for the First Church in Hendersonville. Five came as Honorably Retired: Bill Neely (whose wife Wanda is the transitional pastor for the Morganton church); Bill Lowrey; David Hosick (who was formerly the pastor for the Tryon church); Jamie Lloyd; and Neal Lloyd. [As many know, retired ministers

frequently serve congregations or offer other forms of ministry in our Presbytery.]

A day of steady rain in Montreat did not dampen the enthusiasm of over 200 Presbyterians. They were warmly welcomed by Carol Steele, Vice-President of the Conference Center, and Keith Grogg, pastor of the Montreat church. An innovation was a video greeting from Moderator Melvin Mearns from Israel, where he is leading a group of pilgrims. He has also personally visited many of our congregations, and will do more later. This meeting was skillfully guided by Vice-Moderator Lauren Vanacore and Past-Moderator Susan Denne, with the able assistance of Stated Clerk Cam Murchison.

The service of worship - always a highlight at Presbytery meetings - was led by Pat Bacon, with lovely organ music by Vivian Hare. Esta Jarrett preached a memorable sermon, reflecting on the challenges and opportunities of small membership churches in the light of the marvelous account of the evangelist Philip and the Ethiopian eunuch in Acts 8. Grace Boyer and Katie Cashwell led the celebration of the sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

The Presbytery, guided by Billy Robinson and Anne Morgan, concentrated on Mission, hearing 1. Chrissie Mbewe, principal of the Ebenezer Institute of Learning in Malawi; 2. John McCall, mission co-worker in Taiwan (and former pastor of the Black Mountain church); and 3. Bill Lowrey, who has striven earnestly for peace in South Sudan. These were inspiring testimonies from areas of the world where Christianity is vigorously growing.

Other notable actions at this meeting were: Dwight Christenbury and Jill Kimbirl told about the new Practical Resources for Churches (www.prcli.org) in Christian education; Joseph Taber listed many opportunities for the Youth to learn and serve; Bill Heck and Bruce Granger gave a presentation on "Bounty and Soul" as a means to combat hunger [Did you know that 1 out of every 6 persons wakes up not knowing where the next meal is to be found?]; Jane Laping recognized eight "Earth Care" congregations; Our General Presbyter Bobbi White reported many examples of God at work in our Presbytery, and reminded all that "Our mission is to be the Body of Christ together;" and Steve Elderbrock offered the Presbytery's prayers of intercession.
