#### **Dear Members and Friends,**

As you may have heard, a group sponsored by Shelby Presbyterian Church will be traveling to Israel May 18 - 27. One of the most moving experiences for many Christians who travel to the Holy Land is the opportunity to renew their baptismal vows in the Jordan River where Jesus was baptized. For some the water is sprinkled or poured, others choose to be immersed, and still others are anointed with the sign of the cross. This service of renewal is a time to reflect on the meaning of baptism and to remember God's claim upon us.

During worship on "Baptism of the Lord" Sunday we invited the congregation to touch the water in the baptismal font as an act of renewal. We also encourage parents to celebrate the anniversary date of their child's baptism.

One of the things that I do to remember my own baptism is to keep my baptismal certificate in my study at church. On a shelf in plain view, it reminds me of how my parents presented me for baptism as an infant and committed me to Christ. Remembering my baptism is important to me. It helps me know who I am (I am a child of God), and whose I am (I belong to Christ).

I would like to share some readings from the New Testament that I have found helpful as I think about my baptism:

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28.18-20).

"For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ . . . you are all one in Christ Jesus" (Galatians 3.27-28; Romans 6.3).

"For the promise is for you, and for your children... everyone whom the Lord calls to him" (Acts 2.39).

"There is one body and one Spirit . . . one Lord, one faith, one baptism" (Ephesians 4.4)

As you reflect upon what it means to you to be baptized into Christ, may your faith be deepened, and may you recognize God's claim upon your life.

## SESSION MEETING NOTES DECEMBER 4, 2018

Recognition of outgoing officers, Elders include: Nancy Blackley, Doug Boyette, Agaat Den Hertog, Brock Taylor, and Jill Venable. Deacons include: Spencer Borders, Kathryn Bridges, Mary Lampley, Jennifer Ormand, and Beverly Styers.

Jill reported that the 2018 finances are within budget guidelines. The 2019 budget is in process with 23 families yet to pledge.

Doug reported that he, Paul Woodard, Jeff Hamilton, and John Auten had met with Presbytery staff to discuss how a plan for the transitional period before and after Luke's retirement will best be implemented. The resulting plan will be shared and discussed at the upcoming joint meeting of Session and Diaconate in January.

Henry "Hank" Griffin requested to transfer his membership to First Presbyterian, Charlotte, it was approved.

Luke Harkey reported that the planning for the Israel trip early in 2019 is going well.

Mission and Ministry - Recommended that money be allocated in the amount of \$3200.00 to help cover the cost of church missionaries traveling to Guatemala for two persons or to partially cover the cost of more than two if necessary. Also, that \$250.00 be sent to PWNC to the attention of Maria Palacio to be used to purchase crayons and other supplies for the children of Monte los Olivos. Debra and Laura noted that the existing supplies there were in short supply and in need of replenishment. The money can be taken with the May mission team and supplies purchased locally. The recommendations from Missions and Ministry were referred to Finance for consideration.

**New Business -** A recommendation to send an overture to the Presbytery asking the General Assembly to include the Declaration of Faith in The Book of Confessions was approved.
