Dear Members and Friends,

Lent, as you may recall, is a season of preparation leading up to Holy Week and Easter. I want to tell you about some opportunities for worship during Lent, and I want to encourage you to make regular church attendance part of your Lenten discipline. Often, I hear church members speak about getting out of the habit of attending services, or just not feeling like going. Then, they tell me, once they are in church and hear the choir, or listen to the Bible readings, or join their voices in praise, they are glad they are in worship!

This year our observance of Lent begins on Wednesday, March 6th with an Ash Wednesday service at 6:35 p.m. following our fellowship supper at 6 p.m. The sign of the cross marked with ashes on the forehead is an ancient ritual that reminds of our need for God's mercy and grace. Many of our members have also made it a practice to attend the Community Lenten services held each Wednesday at noon at Aldersgate United Methodist Church. I look forward to seeing some of you at these services.

An important part of the worship life of this congregation is music. Last night the Session approved a recommendation from our Worship and Music Committee that the church purchase a piano for the sanctuary. This is something that has been discussed for years, and now it is finally happening! The instrument that has been chosen is a full-size (5'10") Steinway Grand Piano Model O built in 1907 and fully-restored to modern standards with all new strings, dampers, and hammers. The black (ebony)

cabinet and soundboard are in pristine condition, and the piano has excellent tone. The piano is part of a special mid-winter clearance sale at Case Brothers in Spartanburg and had been marked down from \$29,600 to \$22,499.

The piano will be dedicated in memory of Betsy Martin who took piano lessons from Amy Allen and played violin and piano in the sanctuary growing up at Shelby Presbyterian. Over half of the cost has been raised already. Several church members have asked if they might be able to contribute to the cost of this instrument. Contributions may be made to the Shelby Presbyterian Piano Fund. Questions about the piano may be directed to Carolyn Billings, Sherry Young Thomas, or Jeanne Spragins.

May God bless you during this Lenten season as we prepare for Holy Week and Easter.

SESSION MEETING NOTES

JANUARY 16, 2018

Paul Woodard reported:

- St. Mary’s Catholic Church has donated approximately \$1300 to the Food Ministry. A thank you letter was signed by all present.
- In Sept of 2017, the youth group formed a team to prepare meals for youth meetings. Families of youth group members contribute funds. The Session was asked to approve continuation of this and recommendation was unanimously passed.
- Procedures for locking church doors and turning off lights after Sunday services was discussed. John Brotherton suggested this be referred to the Safety and Security task force and also include Wednesday Night supper. This suggestion was adopted.

COMMITTEES

- Christian Education – Anne Langley reported that the Sunday School classroom used for K-1-2 children has been cleared of excess items. Committee members will begin to work on organizing resource room.
- Finance – Trip Boiness reported that Finance Committee has finalized the 2019 budget. He reported that the budget is solid and recommended that it be approved. Budget was unanimously approved.
- Rainbow – Robin Holland informed the Session that an outside toy box will soon be constructed using funds from Miss Bonnie’s memorial fund.
- Worship and Music – Jeanne Spragins presented the Communion schedule for 2019 and recommended it be approved. 2019 Communion schedule was unanimously approved.
- Worship and Music recommended that Pen Peery from First Presbyterian in Charlotte be invited for a Preaching Mission this year. Recommendation was unanimously passed. Referred to Finance Committee for funding.

NEW BUSINESS

- Session should be informed and approve any events being held in the Sanctuary or Chapel. Worship and Music Committee will work on setting guidelines.
- 2018 Statistical Report was presented for approval. Unanimously approved.
- Dates for Confirmation – Orientation Feb. 24, followed by Mar. 3, 10, 24, 31 and Apr. 7. Confirmands meet with Session Apr. 9. Presentation to Congregation Apr. 28. Elders were encouraged to act as sponsors for Confirmands if asked.

PRESBYTERY IN BRIEF
JANUARY 26, 2019

The Presbytery of Western North Carolina gathered to do the work of the church, worship and discernment, on Saturday, January 26th. The people who are First Presbyterian Church of Gastonia, NC welcomed us into their home, showing hospitality and love to all who attended this gathering of our extended family of faith.

The agenda for this meeting was quite full and began with installing the new Moderator and Vice-Moderator, Rev. Lauren Vanacore and Dick Larson. We thanked our outgoing Moderator, Melvin Meares, for the connectional work he undertook during his tenure, and look forward to his continuing leadership as the chair of the General Council. Lauren Vanacore then convened us with prayer and welcomed us on behalf of First Presbyterian, Gastonia.

Christ's presence in our midst was especially evident during worship. We worshipped under the leadership of Lauren Vanacore, Daria Ragan, Janet DeWater, Heather Wood Davis, Chris Vogado, and Charles Whitesides. Heather Wood Davis proclaimed God's Word, focusing on Psalm 19. We received the sacrament of the Lord's Supper and recognized the Ruling Elders and Teaching Elders who have passed away in our Presbytery over the past year.

The bulk of the meeting consisted of discussion and voting on proposed amendments to the Book of Order. Several of the amendments were bundled into a consent agenda, and the rest were set to be considered individually. Two of the amendments were pulled from the consent agenda before the consent agenda was passed without dissenting vote. The remaining items, including those pulled from the consent agenda, were then debated and voted upon. The closest vote concerned amendment 18-A, which dealt with the composition of Nominating Committees for Elders and Deacons. One pastor of a very small church raised a concern that this would be overly burdensome on very small congregations such as the one he served. After a standing vote, the amendment passed. Due to time concerns, amendments 18-F and 18-G were moved to the April meeting of Presbytery, so there's still time to vote on those and take part in shaping our covenant for how we're going to be the Body of Christ together!

Later in the meeting, the Presbytery had the opportunity to hear a second excellent sermon! John Hagmann, candidate for examination and ordination, proclaimed the Word of God focusing on Nehemiah 8. John has accepted a call as the Pastor/Head of Staff for First Presbyterian Church, Morganton. His ordination and membership in the Presbytery were enthusiastically approved.

As part of the report from the Peace and Justice Committee, Unity Presbyterian Church gave an informative report on their work in interfaith relationships and as an Earth Care congregation. The Holy Spirit guided us in many other reports and decisions. For a comprehensive list, feel encouraged to consult the meeting minutes.

The Teaching Elders and Congregations who make up our extended family of faith, the Presbytery of Western North Carolina, will next gather in Montreat, NC on Tuesday, April 30th, 2019.
