**Dear Members and Friends,**

As most of you know, I plan to retire in September after serving Shelby Presbyterian Church for twenty years. My last Sunday in the pulpit will be on September 15, 2019 as we hold our sixth annual Kirkin' o' the Tartans.

The Kirkin' is a time when we give thanks for our heritage as a congregation, ask God's blessing on our families, and remember that our future is in God's hands.

Several church members have asked about the process in a Presbyterian congregation when a pastor retires. I want to assure you that we have a dedicated group of church officers on the Session and Diaconate who are hard at work in planning for the future. They will be supported by the Committee on Ministry of our Presbytery of Western North Carolina.

At present our officers are working on a mission statement that will be part of a Ministry Information Form used in calling the next pastor. Once this process is completed and approved by the Committee on Ministry, a Pastor Nominating Committee can be established and the search process can begin.

It is typically the case that an interim/transitional pastor will serve the church until the next installed pastor is called. This can be a very positive time in the life of a congregation. I encourage you to pray for our congregation and for our officers as they plan for the future and seek the leading of the Holy Spirit.

In the meantime, I look forward to joining with you as we conclude the season of Lent and enter Holy Week and Easter. I have been asked to preach at the Community Lenten Service at Aldersgate UMC on Wednesday, April 3<sup>rd</sup>. Our Chancel Choir will also take part in that service. Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday on April 14<sup>th</sup> followed by services on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter.

The season of Lent is a time of preparation for Holy Week and Easter. This is a time for prayer and meditation, for worship and growing together as disciples, and for acts of compassion and service to others. In the words of our church vision statement, "Growing . . . Praising . . . Serving: Growing as disciples of Jesus Christ and serving the world's needs for the glory of God."

May God bless us during this Lenten and Easter season that we may be a blessing to others.

## ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

### Have you ever

taught a child to hold their fingers inside their hands and say the rhyme, “here is the church, here is the steeple, open the doors and see all the people?” The wiggling fingers teach children, and adults, too, that the church is not the building – the steeples, windows, or structure – but people gathering to worship God.

There’s something else in the children’s rhyme. As the child breaks open their hands to reveal the people, they move their fingers back and forth, often as fast as they can. This simple move reminds us that the church is the energy and actions that share the love of Christ.

- When disaster strikes, people give, volunteer, and pray so that those impacted receive help and hope, **this is church.**
- When poverty and violence cause hunger and people join together to respond to the need and address its root causes, **this is church.**
- When injustice falls on those who are vulnerable and people join hands with one another and lift their voices against the interests of power, **this is church.**

The church is the Holy Spirit’s transforming power emanating into the world sharing the compassion, justice, love, and peace of Christ. Presbyterians join the movement of the Spirit into every corner of the Earth – and in this season, through our church-wide **One Great Hour of Sharing.**

**We share** – and church happens with women who were once trafficked for domestic labor and now own their own cooperative business.

**We share** – and church happens with people through land rights training and improvements to farming methods.

**We share** – and church happens with those whose homes have been washed away by flood, as the arms of comfort wrap around them, and hands pick up shovels to assist.

**SESSION MEETING NOTES  
FEBRUARY 19, 2019**

Paul Woodard reported that Part 2 of Pneumatrix will be presented at a workshop in Ellis Hall on Mach 23 from 9:00 – 12:00. He also encouraged Elders to attend Presbytery meetings as they were able.

Luke Harkey reported that plans are underway for David Hosick, who has been working with the Pneumatrix task force, to preach at a Sunday this summer. He presented the “Memorandum of Understanding”, this is an agreement of understanding between RESET and Shelby Presbyterian Church to provide support for individuals reentering the community from prison. “Memorandum of Understanding” was presented. This requires no obligation and only states that we are supportive of this ministry. Recommendation unanimously passed.

The minutes from the January 15, 2019 Session Meeting were approved.

Carolyn Billings reported on the availability of a grand piano at Case Brothers Music in Spartanburg. Worship and Music Committee members have visited the store, evaluated the price of the piano and played it and recommend purchase. Funds will be provided in part by the Memorial fund in memory of Betsy Martin. Balance of funds will be referred to Finance Committee and church members will be offered the opportunity to donate. Price is approximately \$22,000 and more than half is in hand. Case Brothers will deliver and set up with deposit. Recommendation to purchase was unanimously approved.

Christian Education - Easter Egg Hunt will be Sunday, April 7, Sunday School Teacher Appreciation will be May 5 and the last day of Sunday School will be May 19.

Fellowship - Robin Holland, informed the Session that the Fellowship Committee will assist and support groups who sponsor receptions. Fellowship should be contacted when receptions will be held and they will help coordinate.

Member Care - Margie McSwain made a recommendation to have Homebound Communion quarterly March 3, June 9, and October 6. Recommendation was approved.

Mission and Ministry - Stefanie McIntyre made a recommendation to sponsor a table for the “Celebrate Hope” banquet to benefit the Rescue Mission on March 15 at the LeGrand Center. Recommendation was approved.

Personnel Committee - Jeff Hamilton reported that Mel Lockhart’s Cleaning Service has been contracted to provide cleaning service. This is a short term contract and requires a 60 day notice for change. Personnel would like diagrams made for set ups as needed for special events. The cleaning service could provide set up for a small extra fee if needed. June Hatfield will handle ordering of supplies for the kitchen. She has begun to inventory supplies. This will result is a small increase in

her hours worked. Recommendation was approved.

Worship and Music - Jeanne Spragins made a recommendation to install hadrails for the front steps of the Sanctuary. Recommendation was approved and referred to the Property Committee to coordinate installation with piano install.

Property Committee - Lloyd Williams reported that the committee is currently surveying the lighting in the Sanctuary.

Rainbow Committee - Robin Holland reported Rainbow is implementing an increase of \$10.00 per month.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer.
