Dear Members and Friends,

I want to tell you about a recent ribbon-cutting ceremony for the new administrative building for the Children's Homes of Cleveland County. Rain did not dampen the spirit of the occasion as Director Peter Bagley welcomed everyone, Senator Tamara Barringer told about successful efforts to get state-funding for young adults leaving the foster system, and Kathy Wilson, who serves on the board of the Children's Homes, recognized former director, Margie Christopher. I was invited to have the invocation because of the historic link between Shelby Presbyterian Church and the Children's Home. So what is that connection?

Fifty years ago, two members of this congregation, Malcolm Brown and Dick LeGrand, spear-headed the effort to establish an emergency shelter for children. This was accomplished with strong support from Lloyd Williams, Sr., and members of the Men's Bible Class here at Shelby Presbyterian Church. Malcolm was aware of the need through his work as school superintendent. In a letter addressed to Dick LeGrand on September 12, 1968, Malcolm wrote: "The school board, school administrators, counselors and teachers eagerly look forward to the day when a residential sheltered home can be provided for this community" (*see rest of this letter below).

The first emergency shelter for children was a house on Green Street here in Shelby. This was the beginning of what became the Children's Homes of Cleveland County. Of historical interest, this emergency shelter was the first free-standing shelter for children in North Carolina. Prior to this, children at risk were placed in a foster home or in a church-sponsored orphanage like the Black Mountain Home for Children.

Later expansion included James Home in Shelby (for girls age 10-21) and Aaron's House in Lattimore (for boys and girls age 5-18) and, of course, the new administrative building on Gidney Street.

One of the outstanding features of the new

building is the addition of two apartments designed to serve young adults who have aged out of foster care (age 18-21). This is significant, not only because there is a great need, but also because this is an important initiative here in North Carolina. These two apartments are among the first independent living quarters for this underserved group (Black Mountain Home has similar apartments in a communal setting).

At the ribbon-cutting we were told that there are approximately 12,000 foster children in the state. Of these, half will never be adopted or return to their family of origin. Of the other foster children, approximately 25% will end up in prison within two to three years of leaving the foster system. But there is a better way. Young adults who have aged out of foster care here in Cleveland County will have a place to stay while they are learning life skills and receiving help getting into college or finding a job. It is hoped that eventually every community in the state will have a similar program.

Support from church members for the Children's home has continued through the years with both dedicated volunteer service and generous financial contributions. For example, on the wall of the administrative building near the office entrance, there is a display listing the names of people, companies, and foundations that have given generously in support of this latest project. It was interesting to me to see how many members of Shelby Presbyterian Church are represented.

If you would like to visit the new administrative building, it is located at 1300 Gidney Street about 1.4 miles from Shelby Presbyterian Church. Head south on Dekalb Street past Bethel Baptist Church. Turn left at the light on Gidney. Continue past St. Mary's Catholic Church on the left. From that point the new facility is .2 miles on the right.

Administrators and guidance personnel in the Shelby City Schools for many years have recognized the need for some type residential home for boys and girls who cannot function in the public schools as a result of improper home environment. It has been the belief of our professional school people that if we had a residential home where children could be placed during times of various type crises in the home, many could be saved from becoming a drop-out, juvenile delinquent, or unwed mother. It is our conviction that until such time that a home of this type can be provided in the community that we will have to share a part of the guilt for the failure of many boys and girls. With a sheltered home we believe that this will make the entire community more conscious of the problems that we have at present with many cases where the home environment is so bad that children cannot possibly succeed in public schools. With a more conscious community we believe that solutions can be found for these boys and girls to provide a more wholesome home environment so that they will be able to function more successfully in our public schools.

PRESBYTERY IN BRIEF

April 30, 2019

The Presbytery of Western North Carolina gathered in Anderson Auditorium in Montreat, North Carolina to do the work of the church, worship and discernment, on Tuesday, April 30th. The President of Montreat Conference Center, the President of Warren Wilson College, and the Pastor of Montreat Presbyterian Church each welcomed us on behalf of their communities and institutions.

This meeting was unusually eventful, with several important proposals before the body. We moved quickly through the Consent Agenda and the Stated Clerk's

Report so that we could get to the most important item on the docket: Worshiping God together.

It is always a joy to pray alongside the music of the Anderson Auditorium's organ. The music in worship was a mix of familiar hymns, beloved spirituals, and newer favorites. Ray Jones, Director of Evangelism at the Presbyterian Mission Agency, delivered a Sermon entitled "Beautiful Feet" based on Romans 10:12-15. We then celebrated the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, and like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, our eyes were opened to the real presence of Christ in our midst.

The bulk of the meeting consisted of the report from the General Council. At our January meeting, we deferred voting on some proposed amendments to the Book of Order due to time concerns. We quickly approved sub-committee recommendations on amendments 18-F and 18-G, exercising our responsibility as a Presbytery to participate in governing our denomination.

We then heard a report from the Discernment Team outlining their proposal for a new staffing model for our Presbytery. After extensive and respectful discussion, the Presbytery discerned that it was not the will of the Holy Spirit for us to adopt this staffing model at this time, defeating a motion from General Council to adopt this new staffing model in a narrow enough vote that the tellers had to be called in to count. The Presbytery then considered a General Presbyter Nominating Committee to find whomever God has called to lead us after Bobbi White's retirement. After discussion, Rev. Katherine Blankenship was added to the General Presbyter Nominating Committee to represent those serving in validated ministries. The General Presbyter Nominating Committee was then approved. Special thanks are due to our Moderator, Stated Clerk, and Parliamentarian for improvising as needed so that the will of the Presbytery could be accomplished as decently and as orderly as possible.

After breaking for lunch at Assembly Inn, we recognized God's call on Kathryn McGinnis and Will Upchurch, approving both of them for candidacy with love and celebration. We also welcomed a new member into our extended family of faith, Rev. Dr. Cynthia M. Benz, who is the Transitional Pastor at First Gastonia.

Our meeting concluded with updates on the faithful work of congregations who are seeking to be good stewards of God's creation, and with a report from the General Presbyter.

The Teaching Elders and congregations who make up our extended family of faith, the Presbytery of Western North Carolina, will next gather at the home of Brevard-Davidson River Presbyterian Church on Tuesday, July 30, 2019.
