

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

"Behold, how good and pleasant it is for siblings to sit in unity again." - Psalm 133:1

With just three verses, Psalm 133 is one of the shortest chapters in scripture, but in these three verses we find the theme that undergirds all of scripture – namely that **God's** plan is for all of humanity to be united again.

Yet, this can be the hardest thing for us. Coming out of the pandemic, we live in a very divided culture. The word devil literally means the divider. Whether an actual personified force for evil, or just the force itself that wells up deep within us, to divide is to oppose the will of God, because it is good and pleasant for us to be together.

The last three years have been a challenge to our faith because rather than build on the idea that was stated at the beginning – that we're all in the same boat – we have pulled away from each other, when our calling is to be united.

Still, I am thankful for two things: (1) that churches of all sizes were forced to go online, where now people in person and online can participate in the same worship experience, and (2) that so many of us have a longing for community after exile in a digital Babylon, that church is a place we again long to be to find connection.

I am thankful that over the past 18 months that we've been blessed to be a part of this congregation, the return of social events has allowed us to grow closer by sharing time and experiences together. Last year, in Lent, we gathered weekly for a study, and since then, every event has grown larger and been more fruitful, especially our retreat with about 110 of you gathered for the weekend.

What's more, this last week we sat in unity for fun at a Shrove Monday Pancake and Trivia night and in preparation for the season on Ash Wednesday. In addition, we joined a unity service with our sisters and brothers at Ryburn Memorial Church and several more churches. **What a good and pleasant month it was in this regard.**

The return of Wednesday Night Suppers has also packed Ellis Hall to learn about church ministries, to have fun, and to share a delicious meal. In March, we will have a dinner and then a series of classes with Professor Susan Carlisle Bell on the Passion and Resurrection in Art and Scripture, and in April, we will have holy week and more opportunities to gather.

Thank you for choosing to spend time with your church family and know that your church's leadership will continue to provide opportunities to grow closer and likewise, extend our arms into the community. It pleases God to see us gather in person and keep people connected online, all while sharing God's love all around us.

SOUPER BOWL OF CARING SOUP RECIPES

Easy Taco Soup

Ingredients:

2 pounds lean ground beef

1 large onion, minced

3 cloves garlic, minced

2 (1 ounce) packets taco seasoning mix

1 (15 ounce) can black beans, rinsed & drained

1 (11 ounce) can Mexican-style corn, drained

1 (10 ounce) can diced tomatoes & green chilies (such as RO*TEL)

1-quart tomato juice

1 bunch cilantro, minced, or to taste

1 large lime, halved

1 pinch salt and ground black pepper to taste

Directions:

Heat a heavy-bottomed soup pot over medium-high heat. Cook and stir ground beef in the hot skillet until browned and crumbly, 5 to 7 minutes. Drain and discard grease.

Add onion and garlic. Cook over medium to medium-high heat, stirring often, until onions begin to soften, about 5 minutes. Add taco seasoning; cook and stir until fragrant, 1 to 2 minutes. Stir in black beans, corn, and diced tomatoes. Stir in tomato juice and scrape any browned bits of food off the bottom of the pan with a wooden spoon.

Bring to a simmer; add cilantro and squeeze juice from lime halves into the pot. Simmer until flavors have melded, 15 to 20 minutes. Season with salt and pepper.

Best Ever Potato Soup

Ingredients:

6 bacon strips, diced

3 cups cubed peeled potatoes

1 small carrot, grated

½ cup chopped onion 1 tablespoon dried parsley flakes ½ teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon pepper

½ teaspoon celery seed

1 can (14 ½ ounces) chicken broth

3 tablespoons all-purpose flour

3 cups 2% milk

8 ounces Velveeta, cubed

2 green onions, thinly sliced, optional

Directions:

In a large saucepan, cook bacon over medium heat until crisp, stirring occasionally; drain drippings.

Add vegetables, seasonings and broth; bring to a boil.

Reduce heat; simmer, covered, until potatoes are tender, 10-15 minutes.

Mix flour and milk until smooth; stir into soup.

Bring to a boil, stirring constantly; cook and stir until thickened, about 2 minutes.

Stir in cheese until melted. If desired, serve with green onions.

Yields 8 servings (2 quarts)

The only white used is in the eyes that are full of sadness and compassion. Rouault was a devout Catholic and his paintings often came after his meditations. Christ has been sentenced, mocked, scourged, spit upon and yet is still determined to do His Father's will. "By his stripes we are healed." (Isaiah 53: 5)

Presbytery in Brief (by Rick Leissner) 134th STATED MEETING PRESBYTERY OF WESTERN NORTH CAROLINA – January 28, 2023 (via Zoom)

Immediate Past Moderator Sarah Thornburg called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m. She installed Moderator Mark Stanley and Vice-Moderator Dana Seiler. Thanks & kudos to all three.

Mark offered a Prayer of Invocation, then appointed Marie Palacios, John Pea, Bob Forsythe and Stated Clerk Cam Murchison as Co-Hosts. Our virtuoso Clerk declared a quorum (177 at max), Mark then recognized first-time Ruling Elders attendees (20) and several visitors/corresponding members, followed by a quick orientation. Cam then requested and obtained approval of the general Docket Consent Agenda (including Nominating Committee, Malawi Leadership Team, Building Hope, and PW), then continued the Stated Clerk's reporting in his always competent, effective manner.

We celebrated a special, spiritually enriching Worship Service – with the Lord's Supper and a Necrology recognition – led by Rev. John McCall, assisted by Pastors Chee Gang; Rii; Alang; Davydi; and Taipei Aboriginal University Student Center Students. John's sermon on "Being the Body of Christ" was powerful and inspirational. The music was amazing (even with the few tech blips) – and "He Came Down" was especially precious and joyful. To God be the glory.

Cam discussed the Special Consent Agenda for proposed Constitutional amendments. Various committees assigned by General Council had already removed 8 of the 24 proposed amendments for further discussion and action at the April 25th meeting. When the opportunity was given for the removal of others, 22 –P was also removed. This means that proposed amendments 22–E, 22–I, 22–0, 22–P, 22–Q, 22–T, 22–U, 22–CC, 22–GG will be on the April 25th docket for debate and decision. The remaining 23 proposed constitutional amendments were voted on affirmatively by the passage of the special consent agenda.

"Inclusion and Accessibility": Carol Brown/Tamara Puffer/Christina Tutterow spoke and showed a powerful video on this crucial issue. Break-out room discussions followed. General Council: Sarah Thornburg reported on activities, specifically thanking and praising Hal Bennett, Melvin Mears, and the "Men in the Mirror" project; also noting expanded grant programs. Finance Committee: Faithful 2022 Finance Chair Charles Sellers presented the proposed 2023 budget. He and Controller Lisa Pressley fielded several questions, and the budget was approved. Personnel Committee: Feild Russell gave an update, noting that 4.3% staff increases were included in the budget. He moved and PWNC adopted the proposed compensation for staff. Board of Pensions: PWNC consultant Elizabeth Little gave a thorough, helpful report on the BOP benefits and resources.

Preparation for Ministry Committee: Dwight Christenbury, on behalf of CPM, recommended moving Lyndsay Beaulieu from Inquirer to Candidate. In addition to seminary, Lyndsay is also getting great OTJ experience at First Morganton as Director of Operations. She shared part of her story. The encouraging words, prayers, and positive feedback for Lyndsay were heartwarming. Dwight presented CPM's recommendation to waive the required CPE for Will Upchurch, due to his previous experience. Both were approved without objection.

Committee on Ministry: Jim Taylor reported for always active COM. Rebekah Beam Carpenter – Transitional Minister, New Hope, Gastonia; Dennis Eugene Hysom – Member at Large; and Joseph Welker – Honorably Retired, were introduced as new members of PWNC on a "John Pea Productions" video providing an intro and answer to two questions. COM also recommended that Long Creek Presbyterian Church be allowed to elect a Pastor Nominating Committee for the purpose of nominating Will Upchurch to be ordained and installed as pastor for a designated term of two years, after which it can become indefinite. COM also recommended validation of ministry for members Lynn Keel, Nathan Sell, Clay Fouse, Joey Byrd, Bob McCully, Tamara Puffer, and Denise Thorpe. Both were approved without objection. COM also handled and approved many other items, and they can be reviewed in D1 through D-4, and 6 other attachments.

CE Committee: Bruce Henderson noted the Feb. 2 "Lunch and Learn" with Beth Gunn via Zoom, and the annual Spirituality Retreat at William Black Lodge on March 24–25, led by Greensboro's Donna Chase. The theme is "Spiritual Disciplines". He also emphasized the importance of CE.

Youth Committee: Sarah Grace Montgomery reported on the many great Youth activities, including Youth Leaders Forum; Youth Guatemala Trip Application; Adventure Day: CROSS Internship Flyer; and High School Mission Retreat (with a well-done video).

General Presbyter Byron Wade answered the question "What's New?" at PWNC.

Kathy Campbell blessed us and glorified God with a wonderful, covering prayer of Intercession. Mark Stanley offered the Benediction and adjourned the meeting at 12:18 p.m.
