As a lover of words and language, I found my life verse in the Sermon on the Mount when Jesus says, "Where your thesaurus is, there also will be your heart."

Seriously, that's what it says. Of course, the word "thesaurus" in Greek, does not mean a book of synonyms, but a storehouse of valuable treasures, as the creators of the first thesaurus surely considered their endeavor to be.

But all kidding aside, the place where we put our most valuable things tends to be where we invest our love. Often this is in family life. Sometimes, it is in our hobbies, in our work. The places where we give our time, our talent, and our financial resources, tend to be the things we love the most.

This is true for God as well. The most valuable gifts of God's own self – the power to love and the sentient will to direct that love – are given to us, the sinful humans made to bear God's image with them. When we invest our valuables – time, talent, and treasure – in service to others, we direct our love like the Father, who sent the Son to humbly live in our limits, die for us, rise again, and ascend to join our life in our Triune God's life through the Holy Spirit.

We don't give to earn God's favor. But also, if we never spend our time, talent, and treasure, the storehouse itself becomes what we love, a false god. If we spend our assets only on ourselves, we likewise worship ourselves. But if we give from our storehouse as God gives, we learn to love as God loves, which is true worship.

Inside on page 8, you will find the debut of a graphic highlighting some of the Emergency Assistance provided through the Mission and Ministry Committee. This fund is supported by 60% of what you give to the Five-Cents-A-Meal collection each month, as well as by direct donations and memorial gifts. Your gifts help your neighbors in crisis when they have nowhere else to turn for help.

In one recent case, a person came to us in total despair, and left renewed in faith because of your generosity. We not only coordinated with other agencies to lift a hefty burden, but I also prayed and walked through scripture with this person asking God for hope. In the office, we were brought closer to God by this.

Thank you for your generosity in prayer, in service, and financially, which make God's love and God's Kingdom visible. I pray that what you invest from your storehouse of valuable treasures will move your heart and the hearts of all served by SPC even closer to God's.

From the Desk of Carol Ann

Safe and Sound



I was hiding in the clothes rack-scared, alone. Every year my family would go to Thanksgiving in Charleston, SC to my Uncle's house. We would

make a trip to K-Mart and it was there where I got separated from my parents at the young age of 5. I was scared. My parents were scared, frightened and when they found me-MAD.

When the youth went on the Creeper Trail a few weeks ago, two youth missed the turn to the bike shop. (It is easy to do- not the first time) They kept riding. The actual trail is 32 miles and we only ride 17. I was the rear and when I got there I assumed everyone was there. It wasn't until after we took the final group picture we realized two were missing. They did not see the people in front of them turn off nor did the people behind them see them go straight ahead. So, the search began... I went with Mike (chaperone) in his van to try to head them off. We kept missing them. Finally, after 15 minutes we called in back up. The fire department, rescue squad and police...... they were all assisting us. In my 30 years of youth ministry I've never had to call in back up. After an hour of looking, I was scared and frightened. I was feeling really guilty that I lost 2 youth until I remembered that Jesus' parents didn't miss him for days! We can laugh now - both were safe and sound. But for me.... I went back to Kmart with all the feelings. I now know why my parents were mad but cried when they saw me. The relief of having everyone back on the van together, heading to Shelby was joy.

Often, we question the goodness of God because we go through trials, but sometimes it is the trials that allow us to know what joy is. If we knew only joy, joy would be ordinary life. Yet, that fear and sadness we were feeling when the youth were missing, gave us a sense of the joy that Jesus talks about for the shepherd who finds the lost sheep, and why heaven rejoices more when a sinner repents.

Years from now, I hope these youth who went on the trip will be saying... "Remember that time we went on the Creeper Trail" and I pray it reminds them of God's love and care for them. And for me, I just hope I remember!



to meet the needs of our neighbors.





SPC Reports & Minutes

SESSION MINUTES SEPTEMBER 19, 2023

Clerk's Report - None

<u>Deacon's Report</u> - Susan Bell reported for Elizabeth Schweppe: The next Blood Drive is October 17th. Needed are 20 additional donors to reach our goal. New Member Class is beginning in October and sponsors for prospective new members will be selected soon. Community refrigerator shelter is being prepped for installation.

<u>Pastor's Report</u> – Drew reported: After further discussion with Presbytery and other groups of predominantly black churches, Ryburn Memorial has decided to make another attempt to revitalize their church. Drew reported that in accordance with previous session approval, an advance of \$35,000.00 from the Habitat matching fund be made to Habitat for purchase of building materials. Carol Ann has proposed a community wide Halo Counseling Conference on February 3rd to be held in our church for our church and the community at large to address relationships and loneliness. Motion by Scoot Dixon, seconded by Roger Holland, unanimous approval.

<u>Online Votes & Minutes:</u> Minutes for the August 22nd Session Meeting were approved unanimously following motion by Roger Holland, seconded by Steve Sisk.

Committee Reports:

<u>Personnel Committee</u> - Laura Lampley reported: Staff bonuses for non-installed staff will be included in each staff member's year end payroll check, and a raise for all staff will be presented to Finance in line with Presbytery recommendations.

<u>Discipleship Committee</u> – Steve Sisk reported: The first Communion Class conducted by Drew and Steve was held with 12 children in attendance. June Hobbs is preparing and circulating an Advent Devotional Program to be filmed and presented on Facebook and Instagram.

<u>Finance Committee</u> – Scoot Dixon reported: Budgeted revenues reflect a slight short fall of \$3,090.00, but reminded Session that the \$3,854.00 of our prior year carryover has not been used. August revenues exceed expenses by \$1,420.00, reflected after the Montreat balance of \$18,000.00 was paid. Cash flow remains strong. Funds have been transferred from money market accounts into CDs. Erin is revising credit cards to be transferred to "KleerCard". KleerCard, the processing company serves only non-profits and charges no fees with the new system supporting good accountability and flexibility. A Stewardship letter has been mailed. Roger continues efforts to secure updated prices for kitchen renovations. A 2004 Ford Excursion has been offered as a gift to the church for use by the food ministry. Matter referred to Mission and Ministry for further review. Vehicle policy unanimously approved upon motion and seconded.

<u>Media Committee</u> – Susan Bell reported for Elizabeth Schweppe: Request that we proof each committee's information on the SPC Website and send any edits to Michelle Moser.

<u>Property Committee</u> – Fred Blackley reported: The near completion of the community refrigerator and suggested that Susan Bell, Elizabeth Schweppe and Anna Schweppe be responsible for decorative covering with Scott Mull to professionally paint rules of operation. Marie is securing estimates for HVAC replacements necessary for the Youth Room, which Fred indicated is our number one property need.

<u>Worship & Music –</u> Richard Dedmon reported: Presented the Communion schedule for 2024, motion by Roger Holland, seconded by Laura Lampley, unanimously approved. October 15th Carol Ann is preaching. Laura Harold was asked to preach November 26th, she cannot preach that Sunday.

<u>Fellowship Committee</u> – Kimberly Dixon reported by email: October 4th, Wednesday night supper will be provided by the hot lunch food ministry with church attendees being requested to bring canned green beans, along with monetary donations. The church picnic will be held Sunday afternoon, October 8th at the Wilson home with chicken biscuits and tea provided. Request attendees to bring a pot luck item and lawn chairs and blanket as necessary.
