

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Are you ready to build a home? A real home on the intersection of Young and Oak streets here in Shelby. And even better: Would you like to build this home alongside four more churches, all partnering with us to build for Habitat for Humanity?

Now, I'm not a builder, but this project excites me. That's because a neighbor in our community will have an opportunity to own their own home and as a multi-church build, we will also be an answer to prayer – Jesus's own prayer on the night he was betrayed.

You see, after Jesus washed his disciples' dirty feet and after he passed the bread and cup at the last supper, John's gospel tells us that Jesus prayed for his disciples – along with you and me and all the faithful. Jesus prayed that we might be one, so that the world might believe he was sent by the Father.

Too often the world sees division and competition among churches, and this is often cited as a reason they can't trust our witness. However, **multi-church partnerships** reveal the Kingdom of God and give credibility to what we say about Jesus. Our joint sponsorship shows that even across denominational lines, we are one, holy, catholic, and apostolic church.

Building a Habitat for Humanity home costs about \$140,000 in materials and sub-contractor labor. Habitat Homeowners pay back the cost of construction through an interest free mortgage and help build their home, thus putting in some "sweat equity." **Sponsors contribute financially and physically as volunteers to the project.** Any money raised will ensure that after this home is completed, the next project can move forward.

The goal for this five-church sponsorship is to provide teams of volunteers for build days and perhaps <u>as much as \$100,000 or more</u> for Habitat for Humanity. An endowed fund for community projects like this will match dollar for dollar up to \$50,000 in gifts to this church build. Joining us in this project will be our sister congregation at Ryburn Presbyterian Church, along with Eastside Baptist Church, New Creation Christian Center, and St. Mary Help of Christians Catholic Church.

We know this is an ambitious goal, but with the generous spirit of five active churches, we believe we can do this and show people in this community that we are all part of the one Church testifying to our shared belief in Jesus as our Lord and Savior.

So please, in this Easter season, prayerfully consider what you can do as a volunteer or give financially to this project. We will be in touch in the coming weeks with the details on how to give, and in the coming months, present details on how to volunteer.

#### From the Desk of Carol Ann



Sunday Night, March 19th, a night I won't forget. The Cleveland County Potato Project has always been near to my heart. I love the thought of people having something to eat while using land that is just sitting there to grow potatoes. When the plea came out about cutting potatoes so they can be planted, I knew we could do it. I had done that with a group during Covid. When I was told they would send me 1500 pounds, yes –1500 pounds, I thought there is no way the youth could do that. So, I put out the plea to get some help. What showed up on Sunday night were hands that had done this before. I watched some of our "mature" members use their knife to whack the potatoes in quarters with eyes in each section fill up box after box with smiles on their faces and laughing. I watched younger hands not quite sure how to spot an eye, study the potatoes while slowly filling their boxes while talking to their friends.

Both hands were working hard... old and young. It was beautiful!

I was reminded of a story I heard once about a church in Strasburg, Germany after the war. It was totally destroyed but a statue of Christ which stood by the altar was almost unharmed. Only the hands of the statue were missing. When the church was rebuilt, a famous sculptor offered to make new hands; but, after considering the matter, the members decided to let it stand as it was—without hands. "For," they said, "Christ has no hands but our hands to do His work on earth. If we don't feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, entertain the stranger, visit the imprisoned, and clothe the naked, who will?" Christ is depending on us to do the very things which He did while upon earth.

Hands were working on March 19<sup>th</sup> as 1500 pounds of potatoes were cut for planting in 35 minutes in order to help others have food. WOW – I think some divine cutting took place!

Look at your hands today – they may be young or old, experienced or not, but they can be used to show God's love to the world.

Have you ever taught a child to hold their fingers inside their hands and say the rhyme, "here is the church, here is the steeple, open the doors and see all the people?" The wiggling fingers teach children, and adults, too, that the church is not the building – the steeples, windows, or structure – but people gathering to worship God.

There's something else in the children's rhyme. As the child breaks open their hands to reveal the people, they move their fingers back and forth, often as fast as they can. This simple move reminds us that the church is the energy and actions that share the love of Christ.

•When disaster strikes, people give, volunteer, and pray so that those impacted receive help and hope, *this is church*.

•When poverty and violence cause hunger and people join together to respond to the need and address its root causes, **this is church.** 

•When injustice falls on those who are vulnerable and people join hands with one another and lift their voices against the interests of power, **this is church.** 

The church is the Holy Spirit's transforming power emanating into the world sharing the compassion, justice, love, and peace of Christ. Presbyterians join the movement of the Spirit into every corner of the Earth – and in this season, through our churchwide **One Great Hour of Sharing**.

**We share** – and church happens with women who were once trafficked for domestic labor and now own their own cooperative business.

**We share** – and church happens with people through land rights training and improvements to farming methods.

**We share** – and church happens with those whose homes have been washed away by flood, as the arms of comfort wrap around them, and hands pick up shovels to assist.

### SPC Reports & Minutes

#### **SESSION MINUTES FEBRUARY 21, 2023**

**Communications: Clerk's Report:** Larry Wilson had no items to report.

**Deacons' Report:** Pastor Drew reported that the Deacons are active and having a positive impact on the congregation.

Pastor's Report: Drew requested the Session ratify the online votes: (1) approval of Columbarium space for non-member who had been attending, but had been unable to join SPC due to COVID and health issues; and (2) approval of 2023 Statistical Report. Upon motion to approve and second, both approved unanimously. Minutes from January 17,2023 and the Congregational meeting of January 21, 2023 were unanimously approved.

COMMITTEES: Finance— Scoot Dixon - The Finance Committee recommended that Session approve an adjustment to the current budget of an additional \$16,000 for new HVAC units for the staff offices (\$15,000) and shelving for the Music Dept in the basement (\$1000). He noted church is in very good financial shape, and that additional pledges have been received after the budget was set. After discussion, this was unanimously approved.

• A second recommendation from Finance is the approval of using up to \$50,000 from the Cornerstone Endowment Fund as a matching fund for contributions from SPC members and the other churches toward the sponsoring of a Habitat for Humanity House on Young Street in Shelby this calendar year. Governing rules of the Fund allow for accessing 4–6% of the principal for such a project, and this amount correlates to that. Another provision of the Fund allows the Session

to approve expenditures from the Fund upon approval at 2 successive meetings. This was approved unanimously and will be voted on again at March Session meeting to ensure we are in compliance with Fund Rules.

• Another recommendation from the Finance Committee was to approve the language of a proposed agreement with Session members of (the former) John Knox Church to receive a donation from Presbytery of Western North Carolina upon the sale of the former church property. This contribution has been designated for the food ministry of SPC, particularly directed at improving the storage of shelf-stable foods in a better climate-controlled environment. Appreciation was expressed toward John Knox Church for their consideration and support. Recommendation approved unanimously.

Mission and Ministry — Larry Wilson – Request from M and M to approve a "volunteer navigator" to set up in hallway outside kitchen during the Hot Meal Ministry on Mondays (on a trial basis) to help individuals find available assistance in Cleveland County. Approved unanimously.

• Drew requested approval to access 6% of E. A. Moore Fund and Ramseur Fund to supplement Pastor's Discretionary Fund (approximately \$2200). Approved unanimously.

<u>Member Life</u> - After discussion, Session voted unanimously to authorize Member Life Committee to remove deceased and requested transfers from the membership rolls. Other adjustments to membership rolls are to come before the Session.
