

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On National Public Radio is a segment called "My Unsung Hero," in which people tell stories of people whose kindness left a lasting impression. Typically, these "unsung heroes" are anonymous and are never seen again by the person they helped.

I love these stories. Some are extraordinary acts in extraordinary circumstances. Others are things any of us could do. A favorite story is one of a woman who simply said, "You're a great mom," to a woman at dinner with her infant and two boys, ages 3 and 6. These words gave the struggling mom a boost of confidence at a time she felt very low. It made such an impact that she is still telling the story 10 years later.

I love these stories because in them, we glimpse the Holy Spirit at work in the world. These truly are divine encounters with the self-giving love of God. In these stories, real human beings, just like you and me enter into moments of need, insecurity, or even despair. If only for a moment, they seek relationship, without any ulterior motive – just love.

In the season after Pentecost, we remember God's words to the prophet Joel, which Peter preached, "I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy." In these "Unsung Hero" moments, God's Spirit is at work proclaiming the love of God amid life's struggles.

Do you have any unsung heroes who were there in your hardest moments? They may not be anonymous to you, but they shared love without expecting anything in return, while you were struggling. Have you ever been an unsung hero for someone, helping a stranger anonymously? Have you used your experience during your hardest times, to help someone through a similar struggle, never expecting anything?

It is in the most difficult moments that selfless love shines brightest. It is in these moments that the Holy Spirit reaches out and ministers to us through others. It is in these moments that the Holy Spirit moves us to minister to others. It is in the love that does not seek for its own praise to be sung, that we see God at work in the world. This is where we see God's will being done on earth as it is in heaven.

Friends of All Ages: Hot Dogs, Tears, Ice Cream, and Bibles

This past week was one of those whirlwind church days where God shows up in every generation—and also in hot dogs, ice cream, and pastel colored graduation gowns!

It all started with a trip to Holmes Hot Dogs with our senior adults, and let me tell you—it was fabulous. We laughed, we ate, and we shared our stories. Somewhere between the bottled Cokes and the second round of hot dogs, I opened up about a broken season in my life. Cue the tears (mine, not theirs—they're pros at keeping it together). But then came the hugs, the wisdom, and the kind of encouragement that only comes from people who've been walking with Jesus—and each other—for a long time. I left with a full belly and an even fuller heart.

That afternoon, the roles reversed. A younger friend of mine was having a rough day, so I did what any spiritual mentor would do: I grabbed her and took her out for ice cream. She shared her struggles, and I got to pass on the same love and encouragement I had just received. (Plus, for her, butter pecan is basically a healing balm for the soul.)

And then that evening came the grand finale—Rainbow Graduation. Our precious preschoolers were beaming with excitement, proudly walking the stage in their little gowns while we cheered like they'd just defended a doctoral dissertation. I got to help hand out the Bibles our church gives them each year, and let me tell you, there is nothing quite like watching a 5-year-old hug a Bible and shake your hand.

I looked at the parents, all misty-eyed and camera-ready, and gently reminded them: Put your phones down, Hold on tight—because kindergarten turns into college in about five minutes. (They laughed. Nervously. Because it's true.)

Through it all, I was reminded again of how the church is meant to work—generations walking side by side, encouraging each other, lifting each other up, and occasionally handing each other a tissue or a scoop of butter pecan.

Romans 12:10 says, "Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves." That's what it looks like, friends—from hot dogs to hugs, from preschool to parenthood.

So let's keep showing up for one another. Let's laugh, listen, eat, and love our way through every season—together.





SESSION MEETING MINUTES - April 15, 2025

COMMUNICATIONS

Clerk - Tom Martin - Feeding Kids CC Thank You for our monetary donation

Pastor - Drew Mangione - Harrill House grant Environmental Steward Fund, Montreat

Response to letter to Presbytery requesting funds for Harrill House—we have applied for a grant from the Daily Change program. Montreat Congregational Retreat—registration is under way, price has increased, and we're emphasizing donations to the Lacey fund, which covers all meals, with hope to perpetuate that fund. Drew acknowledged the efforts of the choir and talented church members and guests for the abundance of special music to be offered during Holy Week worship events.

ONLINE VOTES & MINUTES

Ratify Online Votes: N/A

Session Meeting March 18, 2025—Richard provided a correction: "pledged offerings received were <u>at 41% of</u> the budget"; Session unanimously approved minutes as amended.

COMMITTEES

<u>Worship & Music - Carolyn Billings</u>: Information on gift from Dr. Cribb. Over \$240K gift as invested funds which will be transferred to us. Will be used for guest musicians, vocalists, replacing microphones, possibly for children's handbells, etc. Mary Conner—choral scholars will be leaving soon; they have added a lot of energy to our choir. May 4th—children's music. May 25—senior Sunday with lunch after. Have recently revised the Wedding policy. Drew read the approved administration guidelines for use of the Cribb fund.

<u>Finance – Richard Dedmon:</u> Update–Total revenues are almost \$14K below budget for the first quarter, but total expenses are about \$11,360 below budget, leaving us almost \$650 to the good. OZK--\$1.3M investment fund -when Erin attempted to move it to Fidelity, it was noted that the approved trustees required updating as those documented are now deceased. Wooden shelves in vault have been replaced with metal shelves. Wooden shelves have been repurposed in stage closets. Bookcases from those closets need a new home. Sanctuary temperature issues have hopefully been resolved. Plan to replace the hood fan in the kitchen. Fred Blackley is working on quotes for repairing the main sanctuary doors. Sod has been planted in the courtyard. Sanctuary window exteriors need caulking and repainting. More fluorescent lights (24) have been replaced with LED units. Discussion on whether to move forward with updating lights to LED in education wing while waiting for insulation project to be completed. Determined that we wait. Artificial floral arrangement from Cribb funeral was donated to the church, is currently in library, needs final storage place.
