

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I'm thankful for this moment in the life of Shelby Presbyterian Church!

Over the last four years, about 30 children and youth have been baptized. We've added close to 80 new adult members. Nearly 160 of you went to Montreat. Our choir keeps growing and they will again sing in an ecumenical program for Christmas. We have more than 60 children and youth actively involved in church. Every month, our church calendar has fun events and fellowship opportunities that allow our relationships within the church to grow.

Beyond our church family, you have generously helped your neighbors with the food ministry, emergency assistance, the community refrigerator, and more. You've put your faith in action by serving with Habitat for Humanity, Feeding Kids, Abuse Prevention Council, and more. As leaders in many walks of life and professions, you have influence for good. On top of all that, SPC enjoys financial stability, a great building, and good attendance. (Not to mention a new kitchen on the way!)

Yet, like Paul, should we count all these wonderful things as loss?

It's a strange question to ask, but while these are signs of a vital, strong and successful church by worldly standards, they are not necessarily signs of blessing. Rather, God's blessing is found in how these things lead us closer to God by holding one another in consolation and sorrow, being present amid the death of loved ones, illnesses, lost jobs, injustice, and more. With every success, we know that ultimately death still haunts us, and sin still threatens us. The gospel points us to God's comforting presence in all of life, in and through reconciliation.

With Thanksgiving and Advent coming, we should give thanks! Then we must look for where God steps into our life's challenges and limits. If the Spirit is in and among us, then the best sign of blessing is that we emulate Christ by entering the lives of our neighbors to bring joy through inevitable sorrow.

God in Christ defeated sin and death, but this does not mean we are faithful if we choose to be happily ignorant of the world's ongoing brokenness. True blessing reminds us we are not alone - God is in and among us. As Paul says, the Holy Spirit pours the divine love of God in our hearts.

I pray for eyes to see God at work in and through SPC. The proof will not be found in our success, but in how we respond with prayer for one another and our world, acts of kindness to those in our lives, and how we share life with others.

Our calling is to love as Christ loves us. Jesus lived, died, rose and ascended for us, so that his perfect love might cast aside our fear of sin and death. In the Spirit, Jesus then empowers us to be reconciled with God and one another - even our enemies - through God's self-giving love at work in and among us.

There's something satisfying about hitting the hammer right on the nail. One clean strike, and everything falls into place the way it should. But if you've ever missed, you know what happens — the nail bends, the wood splits, and suddenly, the job gets a little harder than it was meant to be.

Life in ministry can be like that sometimes. We're all builders — each of us with a hammer in hand — trying to build up God's kingdom one faithful swing at a time. Sometimes we hit it just right; sometimes we miss and have to start again.

I'm thankful to work alongside Drew, who knows a thing or two about hitting the nail squarely. We've learned to work well together — even though, as I like to say, I'm a *Baptist and he is Catholic in a Presbyterian world*! Drew has gone to bat for me more than once, bridging gaps and helping me serve where God's called me to be. That's what teamwork in

the body of Christ looks like — different tools, different hands, same mission.

We recently attended the Habitat for Humanity Home Builders' Ball, and someone snapped a picture of us that still makes me laugh every time I see it. In the photo, I'm holding a giant hammer, and it looks like I'm about to hit Drew right over the head! (Don't worry — no pastors were harmed in the making of that picture.)

That image made me think about how, even in the laughter and lighthearted moments, God is still at work — shaping us, teaching us, and building something beautiful through us. Ministry — and life — take teamwork, patience, and a whole lot of grace. Sometimes we swing and miss. Sometimes we bend a few nails. But when we work together in love, guided by the Master Builder, amazing things happen.

The Bible says in 1 Corinthians 3:9, "For we are God's co-workers; you are God's field, God's building."

That verse reminds us that we're not swinging blindly or building for our own glory. We're building something eternal — something that will last long after we've set our hammers down.



SPC Reports & Minutes

SESSION MEETING MINUTES - September 16, 2025

COMMUNICATIONS: Clerk - Tom Martin -He spoke with a county employee recently who doesn't have a church home but admires how we serve the community through our hot lunch and community fridge. Tom complimented staff on a great job putting the retreat together and attributed the increased attendance numbers to the assistance with food costs by the Lacey scholarship fund.

<u>Pastor – Drew Mangione</u> – Montreat Retreat – Even better than last year! Church staff and members of the planning committee led by Carol Ann and Emily worked hard and it showed. Small group time was a central component of this year's program, giving members more opportunity to get to know one another. The Chair Volleyball Tournament and the variety show were big hits as well. 157 attended.

ONLINE VOTES & MINUTES: Ratify Online Votes: Styers Funeral Sept. 26th at 1:00 in the chapel; unanimously approved. Session Meeting Minutes August 18, 2025 –unanimously approved.

COMMITTEES: <u>Property – Bill Jobe</u> –all heat/air work is done downstairs and at Harrill House; waiting on roof repair at HH and education wing to finish insulation work; back door lock—key doesn't work; lots of positive affirmations for new housekeeping company. Kitchen Update –Oct 6 thru Jan 31 anticipated.

<u>Finance – Richard Dedmon</u> –Though pledged offerings and other revenues lag behind the budgeted need, expenses are also short of the forecast, yielding a net YTD deficit of almost \$45,000. This is a historical trend which is half of what we saw this time last year. Kitchen Project –3 bids received 8/28 were higher than anticipated; we had originally approved spending \$110,000; committee proposes funding the almost \$100,000 difference (lowest bid was \$208,801) with recently announced awards from the government's Employee Retention Credits, awarding the contract to Hoke Enterprises with a start date of Oct. 6, 2025. Motion approved unanimously. Mini splits have been installed in the bell and choir rooms as well as in Harrill House. Contractor advised installing 2 mini-splits on the Boy Scout side of Harrill House as conditioning the entire structure would be more energy efficient. This left a need for additional funding to complete the project, which has been paid for by Presbytery grants in the amount of \$30,000 from the sale of John Knox and \$10,000 from the Daily Change (formerly 5-Cents-A-Meal) program. Committee proposed using \$5000 from each of the Anne Potts Boy Scout Fund, the Food Ministry Fund, and from unused gifts in the Memorial Fund. Discussion revealed a communication error and only about \$5000 total is required to complete the project. Motion was amended to take one-third of the \$5000 from each of the three funds. Unanimously approved. Roof update—increased progress—insurance company has agreed to pay for a new roof on the flat section of the education wing which is now leaking. The actual amount they will pay remains to be seen. Stewardship letters will be mailed soon.

<u>Personnel – Carolyn Jackson –</u> Update –Annual staff reviews are almost complete with 1 remaining._Drew reported that our request to transfer Carol Ann's ordination from Cooperative Baptist Fellowship to PWNC was rejected and she will have to take all 5 exams as if she was newly out of seminary. They did approve making her a temporary member of presbytery and they can put her in the pension system, which will allow her to take her name off the roll at CBF. Finance and Personnel will take action to secure these steps. Committee reviewed the Rainbow Connection Bylaws which were written in 2012 and recommended they be updated.

<u>Worship and Music - Carolyn Billings</u> - Baptisms of Mason Tyree Sept. 21st and Cooper Monroe Oct. 19th. Unanimously approved. Emily plans to contact a local company to look at our sound system and make recommendations for updating it in 2026.

OLD BUSINESS: December Joint meeting, currently scheduled for Dec. 17th, can move to back to Dec. 16th since the kitchen remodel will prohibit using Ellis Hall for a blood drive on that date. Unanimously approved.
