

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Years ago, my wife and I frequented a restaurant that had no menu, one chef, only an occasional waiter, sporadic hours, and only a handful of seats. It was hardly the model for a successful restaurant. We loved it.

That occasional waiter would say, "We may not be fast, but we are slow," and this made room for unparalleled hospitality in a kitchen, where the chef made adventurous dishes inspired by local produce and their world travels. She made your meal to order and sold some of the best baked goods I've ever tasted (oh, the Challah). You could come in, make some tea, hear a story about the food being prepared, and be a part of the family.

Last month, at the officer retreat, the theme for your elders and deacons was to "focus on our strengths." We drew on Romans 12, where the Apostle Paul says we have many gifts, given to us by grace, encouraging us to do what we are gifted to do.

Unfortunately, insecurities often cause us to compare ourselves to others, or fixate on our weaknesses and the weaknesses of others. We fail to recognize and use gifts already given to us by the grace of God. When others excel, we judge ourselves for falling short. Likewise, we judge those struggling with something we have conquered.

Judgmental comparison is part of what it means to be conformed to this age. If we are to be transformed, we must offer ourselves to God, not by being perfect, but by **being humble enough to contribute from what God has given us. This is true worship**.

The restaurant fell short in many categories we use to judge restaurants. Likewise, each of us falls short being a "good Christian." However, just as the restaurant leaned into its home-like atmosphere and storytelling, God has given you gifts. Rather than focusing on sins and shortcomings, striving to be perfect, we are called to recognize God's grace and love for us and do more with our gifts. This is not a license to sin, but an opportunity to crowd sin out through our relationship with God and one another.

The skills and talents of our church members have already established this church in its work to reconcile the world to God in Christ. Yet, some of you are not yet fully engaged in service to the church. This may be because no existing ministry fits your strengths, or because no one has recommended your strengths for an existing ministry.

If you have an idea, please share it with me, or another elder or deacon. If you see a gift in someone else, please be sure to encourage them and refer them to me, or another elder or deacon to be part of an existing ministry. Together, we can build on what God has given us and live into our calling in the ministry of reconciliation.





STATED SESSION and DIACONATE MINUTES DECEMBER 13, 2022

Recognition of Outgoing Officers and Parting Remarks: Drew Mangione

- Drew recognized the outgoing Deacons and Elders.
- Each of the attending outgoing officers commented on their time of service.

Report from Finance and Stewardship: Scoot Dixon

 Scoot provided a brief report to the Deacons and Elders that this has been financially a good year for our church. There has been no use of carryover funds and revenue exceeded expenses by \$24,000.00. The 2023 budget represents a 9.3% increase over 2022.

Report from Deaconate: Elizabeth Schweppe

 Elizabeth reported on the upcoming Blood Drive on December 20, 2022. The neighborhood groups are updated. She encouraged those in attendance to deliver Advent Booklets to members who don't regularly attend church.

<u>Update on Committee Assignments:</u> John Schweppe Jr.

 John reported that all of the assignments for committees have been accepted by each of the incoming and present officers.

<u>Session and Deaconate moved into separate meetings to complete their respective agendas.</u>

Communications:

Clerk's Report - John Schweppe Jr.

 John explained the Communion Service would be assigned to Elders selected at random with each individual responsible for securing a replacement in the event he or she is unable to serve.

Pastor's Report - Drew Mangione

 Drew reviewed 2023 Calendar Dates, noting that going forward the Session will meet on the 3rd Tuesday of each month.

<u>Minutes and Online Votes</u> - Minutes for the November 15, 2022 were unanimously approved, upon motion by Darlene and seconded by Roger.

Committee Reports:

Finance Committee - Scoot Dixon

• Scoot reviewed the 2023 proposed budget in the amount of \$645,006.00. He complimented the committees for submitting their requests on a timely basis and especially thanked Joe Ogburn and Erin Borders for their contribution in proposing the new budget. He also reported that we have a carryover of \$42,000.00.

Personnel Committee - Darlene Gravett

- Darlene reviewed the updated personnel policy, thanking Andy Brown, John Auten and Kathy Wilson for their contribution. Upon second by Ben Brooks, passed with unanimous approval.
- Darlene further reported that Bruce Moser has accepted the position as Director of the Chancel Choir, seconded by Cheryl with unanimous approval.

Property - Richard Fletcher

 Richard stated that delivery of the boiler parts has been delayed with accrual of funds for payment.

<u>Media -</u> Roger Holland

 Roger reviewed the revised responsibilities of this committee which reflect newer technology and social media, seconded by Darlene, unanimous approval.

Worship & Music - Ben Brooks

 Ben recommended approval of the ordination and installation of new officers for Sunday, January 8, 2023, seconded by Richard, unanimous approval.

Old Business: None New Business:

• Drew reported that Presbytery authorized a housing allowance for Carol Ann, compensation should include \$29,000 for housing allowance, and \$36,770 for the total of \$65,770. This benefit will not impact the budget and in effect provides her a raise at no cost to the church. By online vote December 19, session unanimously approved this change to take effect 2023.
