Lay Assistant: When they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethpage,

to the Mount of Olives, Jesus then sent out two disciples.

### A RESPONSIVE READING OF MATTHEW 27:11-54

Jesus stood before the governor, who questioned him saying, "Are you the King of the Jews?"

Then Jesus spoke, "You say so."

When he was accused by the chief priests and the elders, he did not answer. Pilate said to him, "Do you not hear all the testimony against you?"

Jesus did not answer him, not even one utterance, so as to amaze the governor very much.

Now, at the feast, the governor was accustomed to releasing to the mob one prisoner whom they desired. Now, they were holding at that time a well-known prisoner called, Barabbas. Therefore, with them gathered together, Pilate said, "Whom do you desire that I release to you? Barabbas or Jesus, who is called Messiah?" for he knew it was on account of ill will that they delivered him.

Now, as he was sitting on the seat from which he ruled, his wife sent a message to him saying, "Let nothing be between you and that just man. For I have suffered much today in a dream on account of him."

Then the chief priests and the elders persuaded the mob that they should ask for Barabbas and eliminate Jesus.

Then answering, the governor said to them, "Which of the two do you desire for me to release to you?"

And they said, "Barabbas."

Then Pilate said to them, "What should I do with Jesus who is called Messiah?"

They all said, "Crucify him!"

And he said, "Why? What evil did he commit?"

And all the more they kept crying out saying, "Crucify him."

Then Pilate saw that it did no good, but instead it was becoming a riot. He took up water and washed his hands before the mob, saying, "I am without guilt for this blood. You, yourselves will see."

And answering all the people said, "His blood is on us and on our children."

At that time, he released Barabbas to them and after having Jesus scourged with whips, he delivered him up in order to be crucified.

At that time the governor's soldiers, having taken Jesus with them to the Praetorium, gathered the entire company before him. Then, having stripped him, they put a scarlet cloak on him. And having twisted together a crown from out of thorns, they put it upon his head, and a reed in his right hand. And having gone down on one knee before him, they mocked him, saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" They spit on him and took the reed and kept striking him on his head. They mocked him more and took the cloak off him, and they put him in his own garments and led him away to crucify him.

Now, going out they found a man from Cyrene named Simon. They pressed him into service in order that he might carry Jesus's cross.

And having come to a place called Golgotha, which is called the place of the skull, they gave him wine mixed with bitter herbs to drink, and having tasted it, he was not willing to drink it.

Having crucified him, they divided his garments, casting lots. And they were set there guarding him. Over his head they put up a sign with his crime written: "This is Jesus, the King of the Jews."

At the same time, two robbers were crucified with him, one at his right and one at his left. Those passing by kept slandering him, shaking their heads and saying, "You were going to destroy the temple and build it in three days. Save yourself! If you are the Son of God, then also come down from the cross!"

Likewise, the chief priests with the scribes and elders mocked him, saying, "He saved others. He is not able to save himself. He is Israel's King. Let him come down now from the cross and we will have faith in him. He trusted upon God. Now let God rescue him if God wants. For he said, 'I am the Son of God."

Likewise, even the robbers being crucified with him taunted him. Then from the sixth hour darkness had come over all the land until the ninth hour. Then at about the ninth hour Jesus cried out in a loud voice saying, "Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?" That is, "My God, My God, why have you abandoned me?

Then some of those who were standing there, having heard him, answered, "This man calls Elijah." And immediately one of them ran and took a sponge, filled it with vinegar, put it on a reed and gave him a drink.

And the rest were saying, Let us see whether Elijah comes to save him. And Jesus again, having cried out in a loud voice, yielded up the Spirit and behold, the veil of the temple was torn

from top to bottom into two. The earth was shaken, and rocks were split and the tombs were opened, and many bodies of the saints who had died, resurrected, and went from out of the tombs after his resurrection. They entered into the holy city, appearing to many.

And the centurion, and those with him keeping guard over Jesus, having seen the earthquake and the thing happening, feared greatly, saying, "Truly, this was God's Son."
