### **JUNE 2021**

#### Hi SPC!

The SPC Session has called a congregational meeting for Sunday, June 6, in the sanctuary right after worship.

The purpose of the meeting is to elect new leadership for the church. Presbyterian church government (polity) gives the whole congregation the right and privilege to select its own leaders.

At the meeting we will first receive a report from our Nominating Committee, chaired by elder Jon Brownlee.

If any member of the congregation feels that another member of the church has been overlooked for a leadership position, then that member may make a nomination from the floor, provided the nominated person has been asked in advance and has agreed to serve if elected.

If there are nominations from the floor an election then will be held, and those with the most votes will become church officers.

After we have voted on elders and deacons, we will receive a report from the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC), chaired by church member Don Bridges. The PNC will bring forward a candidate it is unanimously recommending to the congregation to become its next installed pastor. Each of the members of the PNC will speak and then will entertain any questions or concerns of the congregation. Then a vote will be held.

The pastoral candidate will not preach a trial sermon to the congregation, and will not be present

at all for the congregational meeting. The congregation must rely on the recommendation of the PNC alone, which it elected to do the pastoral search on its behalf, as it makes its vote.

We will release information about the pastoral candidate to the whole congregation as we get much closer to the June 6 meeting date. We withhold information until then so that the candidate's current church does not find out about the candidate's potential departure before the candidate has a chance to announce it. If the name or image or information of the candidate should come into your possession before the identity of the candidate is released to the whole church, we ask that you not reveal it to anyone. In fact, we ask that you not post anything about the candidate in texts, emails or on social media until after June 6.

The election of a new pastor during a congregational meeting is the highlight of my time in every church as interim pastor. So much of what we do together during the interim time is all about getting the right pastor at the right time with the right gifts for a unique church with unique strengths and needs at a particular time of history. Leadership, as I think we all know, is key in helping the church become all that God intends in every chapter of its collective life together.



### **UPDATE FROM REOPENING TASK FORCE**

Our Task Force continues to closely monitor medical and governmental guidance in order to evaluate options to safely move toward reopening our church building for all. Following recent updated information and a subsequent Task Force meeting on May 17, we have made recommendations to the Session which received and voted to accept the following at a meeting on May 18.

Effective immediately:

- All building occupancy restrictions and limits related to COVID are lifted, with exceptions aligned with the North Carolina Executive Order currently in effect.
- Masks are not required in the building, but are encouraged for those not vaccinated and for anyone preferring to wear them as a precaution. This is also in accordance with the current guidance and Executive Order.
- Vaccinations continue to be highly encouraged for all who are able to receive them.
- Anyone not feeling well or anyone who is symptomatic is encouraged not to attend inperson worship or other events.

Additionally, the approved recommendation also allows for and requests action regarding the following:

- The Food Ministry Committee may resume utilizing building facilities at such time as they are prepared to accommodate and safely host those who utilize the services of that ministry.
- The Diaconate is asked to determine when they might be prepared to fully staff our worship services with Ushers, including handling collection of offering during the service.
- Session is requested to evaluate a possible return to the traditional Communion distribution of the elements by August 1, if feasible.
- Christian Education Committee is requested to plan for a return to in-person Sunday School for all classes following Labor Day.
- Wednesday Night Committee is requested to plan for a return to Wednesday Night programs following Labor Day.

While we understand that not all members are comfortable returning to in-person worship and attendance at this time, our hope is to be able to safely accommodate all who are prepared to return to our building and we look forward to many new opportunities to see how we can serve and worship together.



# SESSION MEETING NOTES APRIL 20, 2021

#### **Communications**

- <u>John Brotherton</u> provided an update on the status of streaming services from the sanctuary. A request was received from Heidi Steeves to use Ellis Hall for an event in May. A recommendation was made, discussion followed, and was approved with stipulation that COVID protocols in place be followed.
- <u>Greg Melton</u> presented an update from the Diaconate along with a request to revive efforts to reorganize our committee structure. A commitment was made to convene our Coordinating Council prior to the next Session meeting and take action as needed at that time.
- <u>David Garnett</u> presented the following:
- A request from the Rainbow Connection Board to hold graduation programs in the Sanctuary on May 24 and 25. A recommendation to approve was approved following discussion.
- Commissioners to Presbytery Meeting on April 27 via Zoom were identified to be David Garnett, John Brotherton, and Fred Blackley.
- Nursery staff is in need of additional support. Several potential options were discussed to pursue in the near term.
- A request was made and recommendation presented to allow the AA group to resume use of the building with proper COVID protocols and use of pre-packaged food only at this time. Discussion and approval followed.

### **Meeting Minute Approvals**

• Meeting minutes from Session Meeting on March 16, 2021 were reviewed and approved by unanimous vote.

### **Committee Reports**

- <u>Finance Committee</u> Scoot Dixon provided an update on church finances, noting that offerings exceeded expenses in the first quarter, but both were below budget. The budget has been adjusted within the approved budget level due to emergent needs due to our return to in person worship. An emphasis continues on overall stewardship.
- <u>Member Care</u> Jessi Ogburn continued to stress the need to reach out to our neighborhood groups and is appreciative of updates from our members.
- <u>Membership Committee</u> Martha Noblitt provided information on letters sent to inactive members in an attempt to update our rolls and identify those who may have transferred membership to another church.
- <u>Nominating Committee</u> Jon Brownlee provided an update that the committee has completed its effort to identify a proposed slate of officers for the Class of 2024. Discussion followed on appropriate method to present proposed slate and hold a vote at a Congregational meeting.
- <u>Personnel Committee</u> Martha Noblitt provided an update on the status of filling positions that are opening due to retirements. Interviews are ongoing and offers are being extended for several of our openings.
- Reopening Task Force John Brotherton discussed the Task Force meeting from April 19 and provided further updates on progress of in-person attendance at worship

services. A recommendation was presented to increase capacity for seating in the Sanctuary to 100 people. Discussion was held and the recommendation was approved unanimously.

### **Old and New Business**

- <u>Pastor Nominating Committee</u> John Brotherton presented a recommendation from the committee to approve requests from a candidate. Discussion and approval followed with the Session agreeing to incorporate into the Terms of Call verbiage that will:
- Allow the new pastor to retain a shared copyright to any materials used in sermons.
- Allow taking the Sunday after Christmas off to be with family. This is in addition to the standard vacation allowance required by Presbytery.

### Closing

• David Garnett opened the floor for prayer requests and adjourned the meeting with prayer.

# PRESBYTERY IN BRIEF APRIL 27, 2021

When attempting to join the meeting today one couldn't help but think of those young folks who forgot their oil and were late getting to the Bridegroom's party. They knocked and knocked on the door, but the ZOOM master wouldn't open it! Thank you to Robert Cummings for serenading us with a tune by the Beatles as we waited. (Who doesn't love Penny Lane?) After some challenges with joining the meeting, we finally found ourselves gathered as the gracious body of Christ here in this time and place. We are so thankful for all those who helped make this meeting possible and while we had a few glitches to start, the meeting went forward without delay. Bravo to all our ZOOM techies! We are indeed blessed to have so many talented and faithful folks in our Presbytery. We are also grateful and indebted to the many folks who serve on committees as well as support staff and professionals who give so tirelessly of their time and talents. Thank You!

As we began the meeting our Moderator, the Reverend Hal Bennett called our attention and remembrance to the many Native American tribes in whose lands and cultures in which we live as we minister to the world here in Western North Carolina. To be mindful of where we are and the rich history of these tribes and lands, specifically the Cherokee, the Lumbee, and the Coharie, to name a few.

At least 15 new Elders were participating in their first presbytery meeting as well as several corresponding members, and we always give thanks for this. Participation in presbytery meetings is one way for folks to stay connected and support one another, particularly in light of the past year. Let's keep encouraging one another to share in these wonderful gatherings as we do the much-needed business before us.

We enjoyed a wonderful worship service led by Hal Bennett, Pastor of Dulatown Presbyterian Church, and Co-Commissioned Pastors, Tamika Garrison and Rick Leisnner, who serve Quaker Meadows Presbyterian Church. Pastor Bennett's sermon, "What Things?" gave

us much to consider as we too walk the Emmaus Road with Jesus, walking right along beside us, calling us to follow and serve. That as he reveals himself to us, he shows what he has done for us and calls us to love and care for a hurting and troubled world. We shared in Holy Communion using whatever elements we had at home, proving once again that even though we are gathering across the internet, the Holy Spirit binds us together using the simplest of elements. Thanks be to God!

We welcomed and commissioned Margaret (Vickie) Burgess as a Commissioned Pastor for Dallas First Presbyterian Church. There were several good questions asked of Vickie during the process and she fielded them all with grace and knowledge. We know the folks at the Dallas church are delighted to begin this journey with her.

There were several reports that bear notice. Dick Larson shared the work of the General Council with many items for information as well as future work of the committee. Also, a mention of a new worshiping community in Lincolnton. Sarah Grace Montgomery with Youth Ministry shared photos from their latest mission trip as well as dates for future events. Jane Laping gave an update on Earth Care Congregations (there are at least 9 in our Presbytery) as well as ways to encourage your congregation to join in. Helen Hall of the Dulatown Church gave a wonderful presentation on participating in the Matthew 25 initiative. She shared many activities and programs that work for them at Dulatown and perhaps would encourage others to participate. Other important reports are in the packet for your information, and you are encouraged to read them as you are able.

Byron Wade, our General Presbyter, shared many thoughts about this last year and how he and the Presbytery Staff are adapting and creatively meeting the many needs of our Presbytery. It has been a challenging year for both clergy and congregations and considerable effort is being made to support and encourage those who have been isolated and working so hard from home. Particular attention was brought to ministers who may be burned out or depressed after this year. Byron then led us into a time of sharing in our break-out groups, where we talked about our griefs and challenges. It was a powerful and meaningful time to chat with a small group and discover how many things we have in common and how we are coping and supporting one another. A common theme was the loss of connections that we normally experience when we used to see each other at church. The loss of singing together and making music, of eating those potluck suppers, of reaching out to physically support those who have lost loved ones and those who are celebrating a milestone or birth. So many things we used to take for granted. And yet, there were many expressions of thankfulness for the creativity and courage of those pastors and church leaders who have found ways to adapt and bring worship and comfort to so many. Byron then called us back together for a time of prayer, where we were all encouraged to share either silently or by posting on the chat screen those whom we

lift up to God. It was a lovely conclusion to a successful meeting. Amen!
