

#### **DECEMBER 2021**

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Happy Church New Year, welcome to the Advent Season, and Merry Christmas to you!

I am so thankful to be spending this holy season with you in the new church year. But what's more: I am excited that we begin this new year with a gift from God of 20 new members received on Christ the King Sunday, and their families, which include nearly 15 more children, youth, and young adults.

This is perfect timing for us all – a faithful congregation with new staff and new members. I would like to challenge us to a shared New Year's Resolution: to be open with each other, to grow closer to each other, and to see God's presence in each other.

The church calendar can help with this. It begins the new year with Advent when we remember that God comes to us. Advent shows us that we do not earn God's love. God pursues us. God loves each of us first, while we are still sinners. This is how you and I are even capable of loving God and loving our neighbors. This imprints God's identity in you and me, but this love is not only for believers, but every person because all humanity bears God's image.

Christmas is the next part of this good news. In Christmas, we celebrate that God lived in our limits, even as a helpless child, cared for by a mother who gave herself fully to his care, with the support of a foster father to raise him. Jesus depended on Mary, Joseph and the community in which they lived. God does not need us, yet God desires us enough to have lived fully as one of us to redeem us.

From there, the church calendar goes into the Season after Epiphany, where we learn what 'incarnation' actually means, and how it reveals one God in three distinct persons, or Trinity. Lent is next, and it shows us the fullness of the Son's submission to our humanity, even to death on a cross. Easter reveals the fullness of the Father's love, to begin the new creation for us. Pentecost shows that God did not leave when Christ ascended but remains in and among us in the Holy Spirit. And lastly, we have Ordinary Time, which just ended, where we 'order' our lives around this gospel truth.

My prayer for us is that we immerse ourselves in this rhythm together – <u>longtime members and newcomers together</u> – so we reflect, as a community, the cycle of grace in which God pursues us, shares life with us, endures our life, renews us, and reorders all things.

Living in a community can be hard because it means being vulnerable, secure, and loving toward people outside our biological families, who may be different and even challenge our pre-conceived notions. Yet this is our calling.

God has graciously given much to Shelby Presbyterian Church, may we respond in grace giving ourselves to each other and our community.

# THREE NOTES FROM THE BOOKKEEPER

#### (1) 2021 Donations

The Office will be open Tuesday, December 28<sup>th</sup> through Friday, December 31<sup>st</sup> to receive any end-of-year giving. Last donations must be in at that time, or if mailed, postmarked no later than December 31, 2021. Anything after that will be considered 2022 donations, even if the check is dated 2021.

#### (2) Online Giving

If you have online banking, you can simply set up weekly or monthly giving. Away on vacation, forgot your envelope, never need to be problems again!

- 1. Find Bill Pay, or whatever your Bank calls it, on your online bank account.
- 2. Set up Shelby Presbyterian Church as a Pay To account (this will require the church's address: PO Box 1444, Shelby NC 28151)
- 3. Select automatic payments
- 4. Enter the amount you would like to contribute, the frequency, and the duration of your payment. Remember you can adjust this amount or cancel at any time. Also, you will be able to give any special instructions regarding distribution of the offering. If it is for your pledge, you need not list any instructions.

If you have any problems setting this up, you can contact your personal bank for help. The check is mailed to the church at no cost to you. If you desire to have your donation posted to your church pledge each month, it will be helpful to have Payment Date by the 25<sup>th</sup> of each month. This will give the bank time to print and mail.

#### (3) Giving by Numbered Envelope

The only information that would be helpful on your envelope is the **amount that is inside**. The number on the envelope will identify you to Miranda to post to your pledge/name.

• THE SPC FOOD MINISTRY began food service again September 13<sup>th</sup> providing 50 takeout meals in clamshells. Only 7 were picked up even though numerous attempts at advertising occurred. The next week only 9 of the 35 prepared were picked up. After learning of a need at our hospital, (the cafeteria is closed for the employees) the Food Ministry is providing a meal delivered to different hospital departments every Monday. At this date

we have provided: 25 meals to Respiratory and ICU, 35 to COVID units, 25 to Labor and Delivery, and 35 to ED and physicians.

Please be in prayer as we continue this very important ministry and perhaps add another avenue. Also, consider helping the Food Ministry by offering to help particularly the delivery of the meals and after the first of the year with help in the kitchen. Also, donations to the Food Ministry are greatly appreciated. Although we receive great amounts of food through Second Harvest much of it is picked up by the local needy through the food giveaway on Tuesdays and we often must purchase staples (salt, flour, milk, etc.) and now the clamshells for takeout.

• THE FOOD MINISTRY is looking ahead to Christmas. Every year, we give each guest a bag that contains useful everyday items. Any help collecting these items would be greatly appreciated. Please drop off contributions at the church office.

#### SESSION MEETING NOTES OCTOBER 19, 2021

#### Communications

- •John Brotherton addressed issues with livestreaming audio and the current plan to resolve issues. A need to identify representative for the October Presbytery meeting was addressed with Nancy Hendrix and Scoot Dixon agreeing to serve for our congregation.
- <u>Drew Mangione</u> expressed how impressed he was with the recent Kirkin' o' the Tartan service and looks forward to experiencing the service in the sanctuary next year. A New Member class is in progress and going well. The 2022 Officer Retreat will be held January 15. A motion to approve a policy for voting electronically on items that come up between stated meetings was presented, discussed and approved by unanimous vote. The policy approved is as follows:
- Electronic Voting (E-Votes) Policy: The moderator and the Clerk of Session may conduct votes via email, when such matters are generally considered non-controversial and cannot wait until another stated meeting. E-votes will be ratified at the next meeting. If any three elders respond by declaring the

matter to be voted on 'controversial,' or if they vote 'no,' the vote would cease, and the matter would be tabled until the next meeting automatically. A special meeting, which would allow for open dialogue and debate, may then be called, or it shall be discussed at the next stated meeting.

#### **Meeting Minute Approvals**

 Meeting minutes from Session Meeting on September 21, 2021 were reviewed and approved by unanimous vote.

#### **Committee Reports**

- Finance Committee Scoot Dixon reaffirmed that offerings are still exceeding expenses with both being under budget for the year at this point. With continued focus on overall stewardship, a second letter to the congregation is being planned. A reminder for committees to submit budget requests was stressed.
- Member Care Jessi Ogburn provided an update on our prayer list and encouraged focus in neighborhood groups. The role of Deacons as defined in the Book of Order was discussed with a request to enhance the role of our Deacons in Member Care.
- Personnel Committee Martha Noblitt presented an update on the hiring of Susan Sheffield as our new Bookkeeper with plans for her to start work in January. The committee is in search of a 3rd person to staff the nursery on Sunday mornings. The committee has also been requested to search for a part-time Sexton / Maintenance person. Updates were also presented regarding plans for 2022 salaries and other compensation.
- Worship and Music Ben Brooks presented a recommendation for the 2022 Communion schedule. Discussion was held and the schedule approved unanimously. A recommendation for approving a marriage ceremony in the Chapel for Jo Ann Richards and Alan Callahan was presented and approved unanimously. Drew and Ben presented a recommendation to hold one Christmas Eve service at 5:00 and include the Friendly Beasts as part of the program with no communion planned to be part of the service. Following discussion, the recommendation was approved unanimously.
- <u>Discipleship</u> an update on Sunday School classes getting started was presented and a request of continuing to encourage attendance was also discussed. Plans for a Church Retreat in August 2022 are underway.

#### **Old and New Business**

- Previous decisions to remain seated during singing of hymns was revisited and a request made to return to the congregation standing during hymns.
- A request for retuning Elders to prayerfully consider serving in the role of Clerk in the coming year was made. A transition plan will be in place in early 2022.

## PRESBYTERY IN BRIEF OCTOBER 26, 2021

(Well, "Presbytery IN BRIEF" is counter-intuitive to a full 4-hour meeting!) Faithful Moderator Hal Bennett convened the meeting with a righteous, spirit-filled prayer of invocation at 9:01 a.m. He joyfully recognized first time Elders – 19 of whom introduced themselves, along with two corresponding members. To God, all praise, glory, and honor!

Hal also acknowledged the land and heritage of Native Americans in this region - Catawba, Sugaree, and Cherokee. He appointed and thanked Marie C. Palacios, Bob Forsythe, Cam Murchison, John Pea, and Luke Johnson for their extra help as Host, Co-Host or additional Standing Committees service.

Clerk-extraordinaire Cam declared a quorum (interestingly, meeting attendance varied widely, with the Holy Spirit moving people in and out frequently); 174 was the high point for attendees. Cam seamlessly gave some orientation; gained approval for a virtual meeting; got approval of Consent Agenda (including Guatemala Partnership, Mission Committee, Finance and Building Hope, and Synod of Mid-Atlantic Commissioner reports — and much more — there's a lot great stuff going on!!); covered several helpful pieces of info; and gave a concise Stated Clerk Report.

A nurturing worship service, including the Lord's Supper, was gloriously celebrated. Worship leaders included David Bonnema and Dana Seiler, pastors at Unity Presbyterian Church; Reed Conley, organizing pastor at Artisan Church in Lincolnton; and several lay readers. The service included a beautiful regional video, a great video of the Artisan Church, and a wonderful sermon by David – covering a cautionary fishing tale about we humans always thinking we know best, planting churches, and positive examples of God at work. To God, be all glory, praise, and honor!

We had a quick small group breakout session to talk about positive success stories during the pandemic. Then, General Council chair, Dick Larson, joyously nominated Mark Stanley as 2022 Vice-Moderator of Presbytery and 2023 Moderator of Presbytery.

Julie Hester reported on CE, emphasizing the return of the ever-popular Lenten Spiritual Retreat, to be held at William Black Lodge on March 25-26, 2022, and led by noted CE and artist Donna Chase from Greensboro First. She also reported on the recent CE "lunch & learn", and CE Continuing Education opportunities.

Jason McDougald gave a positive, well done video report on Camp Grier and the impact of Building HOPE. Sarah Grace Montgomery gave the Youth Ministry report, discussing the July 23-27 Youth Triennium (application), Nov 6-7 Middle School Retreat, and Feb. 26 Faith & Sexuality

Retreat. Noah McIntee reported on UKirk Ministries, provided a good video on the "Hillside Grind" at WCU. Esta Jarrett reported on Disaster Response in Canton, sharing a video that was scary, eye-opening, and heartwarming.

Dwight Christenbury, Preparation for Ministry, presented two wonderful prospects for progressing from Inquirer to Candidate status. Brandon Davis and Erin Tolar both gave strong statements, had powerful stories, and deftly fielded questions. Both were approved, then eloquently charged and fervently prayed over. The future looks a bit brighter now. Good stuff!

("Beam me up, Scotty!") Whit Malone and John Pea gave a literally out of this world COM presentation. John channeled a unique take on Capt. Kirk, reporting from the final frontier aboard the "SS C.O.M.". ("Houston, we have a problem!").

William M. Upchurch, Jr. gave a humble and heartfelt statement, answered questions, was approved as CP for Long Creek, then charged and prayed over. Rebecca Gurney was approved for nomination as Pastor at Reems Creek-Beech for a designated 2-year term.

Lynn Turnage was presented for ordination as Program Director at Montreat Conference Center. She gave a thorough call statement and a full sermon, showcasing her storytelling and other gifts, and her love of children. She was examined and approved for ordination, then charged and prayed for.

Robert Gamble, Executive Director for This Child Here, Inc. (also presented a video on his ministry). The following rule for temporary PWNC membership was approved: "When COM and its sub-committee on Examinations judges a minister of another Christian church is adequately prepared to serve in a validated ministry of PWNC, it may enroll such a minister as a temporary member of presbytery during the period of their service." This was primarily for Session moderator needs.

Billy Robinson and Jill Isola reported on Peace and Justice, featuring a video about a new Matthew 25 initiative on medical debt relief. A special collection is planned; more details to come. Also, Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church showed a video on their commendable efforts to end structural racism.

Charles Kincaid gave the Nominating/Representation Committee report, mainly about election of 225<sup>th</sup> General Assembly and Mid-Atlantic Synod Assembly Commissioners.
