STATED SESSION MEETING MINUTES

Tuesday, June 14, 2022

Order of the Day – Receiving of New Members Randy and May Reed were presented for transfer of membership and welcomed into our congregation.

Communications

• John Brotherton thanked everyone for the great success of the Dessert Auction the previous Saturday evening which raised over \$5000 for our Youth and Children's program. The on-line vote which was held for approving the Congregational Meeting to receive the report of the Nominating Committee on Sunday June 12 was ratified by official vote per accepted procedure and vote. A request had been received and preliminary approval provided to allow First Baptist to host a Red Cross Blood Drive on July 19. A recommendation to approve the event was presented and approved unanimously following brief discussion.

• Elizabeth Schweppe presented an update from the Diaconate. They are refining the process of counting offering and resolving questions posed about collecting offering where some individuals in the congregation are not comfortable passing the plate. Additional discussion was had regarding the recent and upcoming blood drives. There is also continued focus on getting to know everyone in our neighborhood groups.

• Drew Mangione pointed out several examples, and expressed thankfulness, for extremely positive congregational interaction with people we are not familiar with. These included overwhelmingly positive feedback from many individuals he has talked with about their positive experiences.

Committee Reports

• Personnel Committee – Darlene Gravett reported the current focus of the committee is on updating the Employee Handbook and updating position descriptions.

• Discipleship Committee – Cheryl Sisk reported great results from the recent dessert auction. The Family Reunion at Montreat is full with a waiting list for accommodations. Upcoming events include a Volunteer & Ice Cream Social, Rally Day, Bible Study led by Doug Bryant, and a First Communion class. A request from this committee was submitted to the Finance Committee to evaluate purchase of a van.

• Finance Committee - Scoot Dixon reported that vear to date we remain ahead of budget on revenues and under budget on expenses. The committee has reviewed the van purchase request from the Discipleship Committee and requests more direction from Session. After lengthy discussion, a motion was made, discussed, and unanimously approved for Finance to: fully investigate opportunities for purchase or lease of various types of vans, buses, or other forms of transportation including new or used options. The evaluations shall also include considerations for use by Youth, senior groups, Sunday School, Scouts, etc. The evaluation shall include impacts on insurance and other cost of ownership considerations and will be reported to Session when complete.

 Nominating Committee – Larry Wilson discussed the slate of proposed officers presented at the Congregational Meeting on June 12. A recommendation was made to hold а Congregational Meeting to receive additional nominations from the floor on June 19 or to proceed to a vote if none received. Discussion and approval followed.

• Property Committee – Richard Fletcher reported on plans to begin changing security codes on the entrance door quarterly and discussed distribution of the new codes. Replacement window sashes have been purchased for the Youth room due to existing sashes failing and painting is in progress for the Harrill House Food Ministry area.

Old and New Business

• A motion was made for John Schweppe Jr. to succeed John Brotherton as Clerk of Session effective July 1, 2022 and to be effective through December 2023. The motion was accepted, discussed, and approved unanimously.

• A request was made to review the process used for cancelling in-person services recently when several people were exposed and some tested positive for COVID. Drew explained the thought process and evaluation of options that occurred. A recommendation was made to develop a formal process for use in case of future events.

Closing

• Following a request for additional prayer concerns and a motion to adjourn, Nancy Hendrix adjourned the meeting with prayer.
