Hi SPC!

The month of March this year is the church season of Lent. The word Lent comes from an old English word that simply means "Spring", which is when the season of Lent usually falls.

Lent is the six weeks leading up to Easter. Lent recalls the 40 days Jesus was tested in the wilderness. There in solitude and fasting, Jesus was tempted by the devil. At Lent, we in our own life recreate in some way Jesus' 40 days in the wilderness, as well as Jesus' journey from Galilee to Jerusalem, which is often called "the way of the cross."

Lent in the church is a time of preparation leading up to Easter. It is intended for church members to be a time of confession, repentance and spiritual discipline, through which we prepare to meet the risen Christ at Easter. It is a time of self-denial, where through physical deprivation we become spiritually ready to meet Christ.

During Lent the church asks its members to give up something for Lent, usually something one loves or is even addicted to, a food, a drink, an activity. Remembering Jesus words that any who would become his disciples must deny themselves (Mark 8:34), we are encouraged to "fast", to give something up, in one way or another, and to one degree or another.

At the same time, the church asks us to take on a new spiritual discipline during Lent, an activity that helps us grow closer in our relationship to God, such as prayer, Bible study, worship, Sabbathkeeping, silence, solitude, selfless giving.

Lent began on Ash Wednesday. Regrettably, we did not have an Ash Wednesday service this year because of COVID. All that touching and personal closeness would have put us all at risk for the virus.

Church members over the years, even those who did not grow up with the tradition of Lent, have often spoken to me of the positive benefits they have discovered during Lent. How many times Lenten disciplines have served as a kick-start, the beginning of the renewal, of their own spiritual life. May it be so for all of you!

BEGINNING TO OPEN DOORS

Our church family has weathered the past year with strength and faith. While we have stayed apart physically, we have tried to remain in contact with each other and uphold our collective Christian faith. Our Session believes that we can emerge from this time as a stronger church that is wholly unified in our mission to Grow, Praise, and Serve. With that mindset, our Session created a Reopening Task Force shortly after we became unable be together and assigned a mission to focus on actions that would assure we were doing what was necessary to maintain our existing ministry and also to prepare for new opportunities after this pandemic subsides. By Session approval of recommendations from the Task Force and several of our committees, we have introduced innovative ways to provide worship opportunities that we have not experienced before. These include on-line recorded worship and bible study, Zoom Sunday School sessions, and outdoor worship at the Farmers Market Pavilion. Most recently, we have finally achieved the milestone of streaming a service live from our sanctuary.

Our Task Force recently surveyed the congregation to obtain feedback on the overall feeling about beginning to open the doors for indoor worship opportunities in the coming months. A total of 47 responses (representing 98 members) is summarized here:

- 16 responses (32 members) indicated they would return in March.
- 14 responses (28 members) indicated they 'Maybe' would return in April.
- 11 of 29 responses (21 members) which indicated they would not return in March did agree that it is acceptable for those wishing to do so.
- 16 responses (33 members) have attended outdoor worship, but will not attend indoor worship in March. Of those, 6 responses (12 members) would also not attend indoor worship in April.

The Task Force unanimously recommended the following protocols for review by our Session, which voted and approved for these to be instituted and the congregation be allowed to attend live indoor services beginning March 7th:

 Eighteen (18) household unit reservations will be available each week (14 spots in the sanctuary plus 4 in the balcony). A

- reservation could be 1 person, or everyone living in a household.
- A maximum congregation of 50 will be permitted to be present.
- Every third pew would be used while the two between would remain empty and assure spacing would exceed 6' between individuals not living in the same household.
- Controlled entry, assigned seating with reservations, and organized exit by members would be guided by officers and trained volunteers.
- No one should attend if they are not feeling well or are aware they may have been exposed to anyone who has tested positive for COVID within the previous week.
- Masks would be required at all times.
- Hand sanitizer would be available.
- Bulletins would be located at each assigned seat.
- The service itself would be modeled after the successful outdoor services that have been taking place with no singing, no passing the offering plate, communion trays, etc.
- The task force does not recommend removing cushions, hymnals, or Bibles from the pews.
- The sanctuary will be cleaned weekly by the cleaning contractor using currently accepted procedures.
- Outdoor services may be offered in addition to indoor services as weather permits.

We understand that the decision to hold indoor worship in this manner will not address everyone's concerns about whether each and every one of us can return. However, we believe this is the time to take the next step in beginning to open our doors and return to worship and fellowship in our sanctuary on a regular basis. For those who believe it is time to participate in these services, we hope to see you in the pews soon. For those who choose to utilize on-line opportunities to participate, please continue to provide feedback on ways to improve and provide all our members an opportunity to have meaningful worship.

- A motion from the Finance Committee was made to approve the 2021 Budget.
- Discussion included:

Budget for 2021 – Finance Committee Chair Scoot Dixon

The Approved Budget for 2021 was presented along with the 2020 Budget for comparison.

- •Pledges for 2021 are slightly lower than 2020, however this is somewhat anticipated due to the uncertainty presented by the ongoing COVID Pandemic.
- •2020 unpledged offerings were up and we finished the year positively in relation to the budget.
- •The number of families submitting pledges for 2021 is down slightly, however the average amount of pledges from those received has increased.
- •Encouragement was provided to the congregation to continue in stewardship of both time and talents in addition to pledged financial giving.
- •Questions from the floor were called for; none were forthcoming.
- •Members were invited to see the full itemized budget in the Church office and questions are welcomed for the Finance Committee.

- •A vote for the two nominees, Robin Holland and Thomas Couch, was called and passed unanimously.
- Prayers for the Nominating Committee were asked for as they complete their work.
- •The meeting was closed with Prayer by Interim Pastor David Garnett.

PRESBYTERY IN BRIEF JANUARY 30, 2021

The 126th Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of Western North Carolina met on January 30, 2021 via the miracle of Zoom.

Cam Murchison and Marie Palacios were very patient in answering our questions about how to make it work, and how to vote, and how to raise our hands. They'd be good kindergarten teachers! We are grateful for their careful advice and for them and others who ran the technical side of this meeting.

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 AM by the moderator, Dick Larson. He immediately installed the moderator for 2021, Hal Bennett, and vice-moderator, Sarah Thornburg.

The moderator called for the Clerk to present the docket, which was adopted by common consent. A quorum was present.

The consent agenda was adopted by common consent.

Beth Gunn, staff Associate Presbyter for Youth, announced that the Presbytery High School Mission Retreat has been rescheduled to March 26-27 with a new format.

Our ever-cheerful General Presbyter, the Rev. Dr. Byron Wade, led us in worship, assisted by the Rev. Leah Epps of Fairview and United Churches in Lenoir, and the Rev. John Hagmann of First Church, Morganton. Organist Glenn Little of the Davie Street Church in Raleigh provided the music. The sacrament of communion was celebrated, and all were able to partake in their homes. The sermon was on Mark 1:21-28.

After worship, we were split into twenty-two breakout rooms by our able administrators. We shared with a few people what our congregations have been doing during this very strange year.

Coming back to plenary, we resumed our meeting. Charles Sellers presented the budget for 2021, and answered a few questions. The budget was adopted by common consent.

The Personnel Committee presented the remuneration amounts for the Presbytery's staff; this passed.

Whit Malone attempted to present the COM report, but was overtaken by the radio station PWNC, 530 AM, where "Mo Degrassi" (sometimes known as John Pea) presented several people:

• Rob Warren was welcomed as new pastor at First, Marion;

• Lynn and Robin Honeycutt were examined by the Presbytery to become Commissioned Co-Pastors at the Sweetwater church. The examination was sustained, and Lynn and Robin were commissioned. Sweetwater will celebrate this at a Service of New Beginnings soon.

The General Presbyter, the Rev. Dr. Byron Wade, reported on his activities these first few months, and his offer of "video lunch dates" for those interested.

The Rev. Tempe Fussell prayed prayers of intercession for those whose names we raised.

Moderator Hal Bennett prayed for the Presbytery's work and ministry, and the meeting was adjourned exactly at noon!
