Sisters and Brothers in Christ, What does it mean to be a 'good steward'? What is 'stewardship'?

We hear this word every fall in our church during 'Stewardship Season,' and in many churches, it becomes background noise. It's just another church word and when we hear it, we know that we are being asked to pledge money for the church.

But how often do we think about what 'stewardship' means in our walk with Jesus?

First off, stewardship is not actually about giving money. It's about how we reflect the image of God in the world. Stewardship is about how we 'rule,' or cultivate what God has made, and how we 'watch' over it. We are called to be good stewards in following Jesus.

Good stewardship means not letting our time, talent, and treasure rule over us, but instead taking the resources that God has given us in this world and applying them to our parts in God's ministry of reconciliation. Good stewardship is about using your resources to build and watch over the part of God's reign to which you have been called. Stewardship is cultivating and watching over the Kingdom of God that is both present and eternal.

You demonstrate good stewardship when you participate in weekly worship online and safely in person, and when you cultivate spiritual practices in your personal life. You demonstrate good stewardship when you help someone, share a kind word, or reach out to listen. You demonstrate good stewardship when you put others first, accepting limits so others might flourish, just as God accepted the limits of human existence in Jesus so that we might flourish in God's Kingdom.

SESSION MEETING NOTES AUGUST 10, 2021

Communications

• John Brotherton welcomed and introduced Drew Mangione as our new Pastor. An update from the July Presbytery meeting held virtually via Zoom and attended by John Auten and John Brotherton was provided, including a brief summary of Drew's introduction to the Presbytery. Diaconate meeting was held on August 8, but Greg Melton was not available to provide an update at this meeting. A discussion was held regarding continued intent to resume collecting offering during worship and also to resume Wednesday night programs in September. Additional discussion focused on reconvening the Reopening Task Force due to current pandemic-related trends.

• <u>Drew Mangione</u> discussed getting to know everyone and how he hopes to moderate Session meetings and report to the elders.

Meeting Minute Approvals

• Meeting minutes from Session Meeting on June 15, 2021 has been approved via electronic review and approval prior to David Garnett's departure by unanimous vote.

Committee Reports

• Finance Committee – Scoot Dixon provided an update on church finances, noting that both offerings and expenses remain below budget. Continuing to stress a focus on Stewardship and noted that our 2022 budget process will begin in September.

• Personnel Committee – Darlene Gravett presented an update from the committee's efforts to fill the Bookkeeper position. A recommendation was presented from the Personnel Committee to move Carol Ann Hoard to a 40-Hr per week full-time position and adjust her salary to more properly compensate for expectations. The recommendation was presented appropriately, was voted on and passed unanimously.

• Property Committee – Richard Fletcher noted that the committee is meeting as needed and completing miscellaneous repairs. Upcoming work to strip and wax education building floors will need volunteers to move furniture.

Old and New Business

• Jon Brownlee – recommended we re-visit the policy on vaccinations and masks for staff and for Rainbow Connection. Discussion followed with overall support for referring evaluation of the policy to the Reopening Task Force and also supporting Rainbow Connection to consider mask requirements beyond those adopted by Cleveland County Schools.

• Ben Brooks provided an update from Worship and Music Committee. The committee would like to resume holding two services beginning September 26. The recommendation was tabled until a future meeting.

• Drew Mangione provided an update on the status of our copyright license. The church is pursuing an updated license that will better cover any potential gaps in the existing licenses for both content in services and for video streaming.

Closing

• Drew Mangione adjourned the meeting with prayer.
