Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

With the Thanksgiving holiday approaching, it seems appropriate for a 'gratitude check.' After all, 'gratitude' is good for us. Study after study links our thankfulness to better outcomes in our health, our success, and our relationships.

What's more, gratitude is central to following Jesus. The source of both the word, and our own gratitude is 'gratia,' or 'grace.'

What we have to be thankful for first and foremost is that God loves you and me as we are, and favors us, not for anything we have done or accomplished, but simply because of who Jesus is and what he has done.

Remember this - When you struggle in sin, when it is hard to love others, especially those who quarrel with you, and whenever you worry if you measure up: God's grace is real. Jesus truly is our best reason to be thankful.

As I noted earlier, 'Gratitude is good for you.'

Of course, I realize an 'attitude of gratitude' is not something you can just switch on when you need it. Gratitude needs to be cultivated.

Still, I want to encourage you to develop an 'attitude of gratitude.' In August, Harvard Medical School published six helpful ways to make gratitude grow, which I have adapted and condensed to three:

• Write thank you notes to people who have impacted your life positively, not just notes for gifts you have recently received.

- Thank someone in your mind or in a journal. You may not have time to write and mail, but you can be mindful of reasons to be thankful for others. and set aside criticisms.
- Pray for gratitude and count your blessings. Ask God to help you see the good in others and your own life, to find favor or grace, as God has been gracious to you.

So, in this season, let's make a point of focusing on what we have to be thankful for in our lives and as a church. Through this exercise, we can look for how God is at work in and through us.

We have a lot to be thankful for as a church. For starters, we are able to gather in our sanctuary and even from our homes on Sunday mornings for worship. You have assembled a staff that loves working together. The music has been great. The children's and youth programs are energized. Sunday School is up and running, and you have been faithful - both longtime members and new ones too - to participate in person and online for worship each week.

It is an exciting time to be a part of Shelby Presbyterian Church. I hope you will join me in giving thanks and working together to ensure we live into what it is God is calling us to do.

As the Psalmist said, "O give thanks to the Lord, who is good, whose faithful and merciful loving-kindness endures forever." – Psalm 118:1



SESSION MEETING NOTES SEPTEMBER 21, 2021

Communications

• John Brotherton highlighted events over the month including several who had been exposed and recovered from COVID, re-convening our Reopening Task Force for updated considerations and guidance in various areas, moving worship into Ellis Hall until the sanctuary HVAC issues can be repaired, and stressed to chairs of each committee the needs to focus on budget work for the upcoming year.

• <u>Drew Mangione</u> reiterated his appreciation for opportunities to get to know everyone and noted his perception of how efficiently we seem to be with our meetings and committees. Drew is looking forward to the budget process and noted the structure being excellent. Additionally, Drew feels people are getting more comfortable with him and is seeing more pastoral care opportunities develop.

Meeting Minute Approvals

• Meeting minutes from Session Meeting on August 10, 2021 were reviewed and approved by unanimous vote.

Committee Reports

• Discipleship – Ben Brooks presented a recommendation from the committee to move Rally Day to October 3rd with Sunday School beginning on October 10th. Discussion followed with clarification that depending on attendance in children's classes, some age groups may be combined and that adult classes may choose to delay in-person gathering beyond October 10th. The recommendation was

approved unanimously and requested that Carol Ann be involved in communication to various classes and parents. Additionally, the Youth will attend a Presbytery Youth Rally at Montreat on October 3 and the Halloween festival will be on October 31. Nancy Hendrix made a motion that volunteers be allowed to prepare meals for Youth meetings on Sunday evenings. Meals would be served in takeout boxes and eaten outside (weather permitting) or with social distancing in Ellis Hall in inclement weather. After discussion, the motion was approved unanimously.

• Finance Committee – John Brotherton provided an update from Scoot Dixon on church finances, noting that both offerings and expenses remain below budget with offerings exceeding expenses year-todate. A letter will be sent from Stewardship Committee to the congregation in preparation for Stewardship Sunday on October 10.

• Personnel Committee – Martha Noblitt reported the committee is pursuing candidates for the Bookkeeper position after updating the job description and qualifications.

• Property Committee – Richard Fletcher reported on the current plan to upgrade fan motors on the sanctuary HVAC condenser unit due to further extensive delays in direct replacement of the failed motors. Additionally, the floor refinishing work in the Education wing has been completed and landscaping and beautification efforts are in progress in the courtyard and in front of the building.

Old and New Business


• A motion was made to discuss the item tabled at our last meeting regarding the Worship & Music committee recommendation to resume two services. The motion to discuss was approved and proceeded. After much discussion the theme of growing together and filling our sanctuary to capacity for now and focusing one service per month toward a more contemporary style is preferred. The motion to resume two services was subsequently voted on and rejected unanimously.

• Discussion of the beginning of Advent and Hanging of the Greens timing in conjunction with Thanksgiving weekend was held. Additionally, discussion on observing the 12 days of Christmas ensued regarding the timing of removing the decorations. More planning is required but past practices of decorating will be employed where feasible to involve the congregation in decorations.

• Drew discussed upcoming New Officer training and timing for sessions as well as installation and ordination of new officers.

• A request was received and presented to approve our Girl Scouts holding an event in Ellis Hall on September 24. The event was approved unanimously. **Closing**

• Drew Mangione adjourned the meeting with prayer.
