Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Happy New Year! What a joy it has been to spend the Advent and Christmas seasons with you. Shelby at Christmas is a beautiful place to be and as a family, we are so thankful to be here with all of you for 2022.

Every new year brings new optimism, but the feeling this year may be more than usual. After all, there is a lot to be optimistic about at SPC. The Holy Spirit is calling us toward new opportunities, so we want to be sure that our will and actions align with the Spirit's will.


NEWS FROM RAINBOW CONNECTION

SESSION MEETING NOTES NOVEMBER 16, 2021

Order of the Day – Receive New Members

The following were presented and examined for membership: Doug & Julie Bryan, Joel Hoard, June Hobbs, Mike & Marie Jackson, Thomas & Emily Monroe, Bruce & Michelle Moser, Michael & Alexis Pruitt, Lucas & Jessica Stern, Bill & Patty Thorne, and Trey & Tara Warrick. Nell Canipe and Patrick Glenn were not able to be present at the meeting. Additionally, these families bring 17 children ages newborn to college. A motion to accept all 20 new members was presented and accepted with a unanimous vote of approval following. New members were welcomed and invited to remain or be excused at that time.

Communications

• John Brotherton communicated that the current recommendation from the COVID Task Force was to maintain the status quo of current practices during worship and other gatherings within the church building. Additionally, it was reported that the Coordinating Council had met to identify committee assignments for 2022 and that communication to all officers serving in 2022 is in progress.

• Drew Mangione identified a correction that the upcoming Officer Retreat would be held on January 8 instead of January 15 which had been identified in a previous meeting. As such, ordination of new officers will be on January 9, 2022. All officers are requested to attend.

• Presbytery Meeting Update – Scoot Dixon and Nancy Hendrix discussed their experience attending the October Presbytery meeting and recommended each officer make it a point to attend at least 1 meeting while they are serving.

Committee Reports

• Finance Committee – Scoot Dixon reaffirmed that offerings are still exceeding expenses with both being under budget for the year at this point. With continued focus on overall stewardship, a second letter to the congregation is being planned. A reminder for committees to submit budget requests was stressed.

• Member Care – John Brotherton provided an update from Jessi Ogburn with the prayer list and requests for focus on members and neighborhoods to continue.

• Personnel Committee – Martha Noblitt presented an update on the salary for our Rainbow Connection Director. Following review and approval from Presbytery, a title change will be made for Carol Ann Hoard. Her title will change from Director of Christian Education and Youth and will now be identified as our Minister of Christian Education and Families. Additionally, Drew Mangione presented an update to our Background Check Form and an expectation for Safe Gatherings training for selected staff and volunteers.

• Worship and Music – Ben Brooks presented a recommendation to move Communion from Christmas Eve to the December 19 worship service. The recommendation was approved unanimously.

Drew Mangione presented a recommendation from the committee to approve Rainbow Connection holding their Christmas Program in the Sanctuary on December 15 and 16. This approved unanimously. It was also reported that Carol Ann will preach on November 28 and December 26 when Drew is on vacation.

• Fred Blackley graciously volunteered to be our Commissioner for the January 29, 2022 Presbytery Meeting that will be held via Zoom.

Discipleship Ministry (Christian Ed, Spiritual Life, Youth)

This committee builds disciples of Christ by providing opportunities and resources for spiritual growth through Sunday School, Bible studies, personal devotion, home study, and activities for youth and families.

____ Fellowship

This committee fosters Christian community through hospitality and meals, including through the Wednesday Night Supper program, Sunday Morning Fellowship time after services, event receptions and more.

Finance (Special Funds, Stewardship and Memorials)

This committee oversees the church's financial resources to ensure God's gifts are used to serve God's reign, by monitoring finances and budgets, promoting member involvement and managing memorial gifts and requests.

____ Media Outreach

This committee promotes God's work in the church through Facebook, YouTube and Website outreach. This committee is also responsible for advertising, press releases, pamphlets, outdoor signs, and worship technology.

_ Member Life Ministry (Membership, Member Care, Funeral Guild)

This committee connects current and future members of the church through prayer, outreach to visitors, personal care for members, home and facility visitations, and other opportunities to share God's love and compassion.

_ Missions and Ministry (Missions & Ministry, Food Ministry, Blood Drive)

This committee gives members opportunities to serve those in need through direct service in the food ministry and emergency aid, as well as local, regional and global projects to share God's love through works of mercy.

Personnel

This committee hires, maintains and supports staff, while also creating and administering policies that comply with state and federal law empowering the church in its mission to serve Christ.

Property (Property, Columbarium, Kitchen, Safety & Security)

This committee is superintendent of all buildings and grounds belonging to the church, ensuring they are properly maintained and repaired when needed, including the Columbarium.

____ Rainbow Connection

This committee serves as a board of directors for the Rainbow Connection Pre-School (Mother's Morning Out) program, to support its work to prepare children for school and contribute to their faith development. [Membership in this committee is limited by Rainbow's bylaws, but interest in this committee will be noted to help generate lists of potential volunteer, substitute teachers, and other duties.]

_ Worship, Music & Ministry (Worship & Music, Communion, Worship Guild, Kirkin' O' Tartans)
