Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As we look forward to Easter this month, I want us to recognize some glimpses of resurrection and new creation right here at Shelby Presbyterian Church.

First off, we have caught a glimpse of this with more than 55 people who have recently begun praying, serving, giving, and worshiping at SPC, adding to what has already been such a vibrant and faithful church congregation.

In November, 20 adult members with 16 children became members and last month, you welcomed five more adults with five children. What's more, another 10 or more new friends of the church have been worshiping and serving here too.

This is God at work. When the Bible speaks of new creation, the word we translate as 'new' is not a word for destroying and replacing, but rather for renewing and restoring. This influx of new talents, ideas and energy is God's way of making all things new here at Shelby Pres through renewal.

It is also God at work in and through you: It is great to see longtime members building new relationships and serving alongside new faces as one church.

Second, we have also seen the restoration of traditions that create cohesion and connection in our congregation. The Children's Choir is back, getting ready to sing this month, and the Bell Choir is getting ready to make its offering as well. More than 90 of you came to Ash Wednesday and we have restored the slate of Holy Week services.

Perhaps most exciting of all is the return of the church retreat at Montreat, with plans for a two-night stay in Assembly Inn, where we can gather together for worship, play and rest to build bonds between generations that we hope will last a lifetime.

We are seeing renewal and restoration here at Shelby Pres. I strongly encourage you to take a good look at what God is doing here and jump in. Just be ready to see where God will lead you, me, and all of us, in the midst of this.

Drew assigned the Confirmation Class to read Unoffendable by Brant Hansen. He gave me a copy and I was convicted by it. (I think he knew it would!) Who knew that this book could be life-changing, that by letting go of certain things we can learn to take the focus off of ourselves to serve others like Jesus? We can do that by letting go of all anger, bitterness, and resentment. AND THAT IS HARD. So often we feel we have the right to be angry. Well at least I have over the past year.

As individuals we actually like to be angry and offended. Learning to let things go, to not take offense, and not make it personal, is the biggest hurdle we face. If we can manage to not be offended and keep a mindset of gratitude life will go much better for us. "Because that's the thing about gratitude and anger: They can't coexist. It's one or the other. One drains the very life from you. The other fills your life with wonder. Choose wisely." (page 44) If we can have an attitude of gratitude and humility, you and I will quite naturally be less easily offended.

Hansen points out that, "Choosing to be unoffendable means choosing to be humble. Not only that, the practice teaches humility. Once you've decided you can't control other people; once you've reconciled yourself to the fact that the world, and its people, are broken; once you've realized your own moral failure before God; once you've abandoned the idea that your significance comes from anything other than God, you're growing in humility, and that's exactly where God wants us all." "'When we surrender our perceived "rights," when we let go of our attempts to manipulate, we find —surprise!—joy." (page 199) I'm still learning and during this season of Lent, what a better time to shed those things that burden us and weigh us down. Choosing joy instead of being angry and offended is the way Jesus would want us to live. It's hard but it is what we are called to do.

Have you ever taught a child to hold their fingers inside their hands and say the rhyme, "here is the church, here is the steeple, open the doors and see all the people?" The wiggling fingers teach children, and adults, too, that the church is not the building – the steeples, windows, or structure – but people gathering to worship God.

There's something else in the children's rhyme. As the child breaks open their hands to reveal the people, they move their fingers back and forth, often as fast as they can. This simple move reminds us that the church is the energy and actions that share the love of Christ.

- •When disaster strikes, people give, volunteer, and pray so that those impacted receive help and hope, *this is church.*
- •When poverty and violence cause hunger and people join together to respond to the need and address its root causes, *this is church*.
- •When injustice falls on those who are vulnerable and people join hands with one another and lift their voices against the interests of power, *this is church*.

The church is the Holy Spirit's transforming power emanating into the world sharing the compassion, justice, love, and peace of Christ. Presbyterians join the movement of the Spirit into every corner of the Earth — and in this season, through our church-wide <u>One Great Hour of Sharing</u>.

We share – and church happens with women who were once trafficked for domestic labor and now own their own cooperative business.

We share — and church happens with people through land rights training and improvements to farming methods.

We share – and church happens with those whose homes have been washed away by flood, as the arms of comfort wrap around them, and hands pick up shovels to assist.

SESSION MEETING NOTES FEBRUARY 15 2022

Communications

<u>John Brotherton</u> reported that the COVID Task Force had not met since the last Session meeting and had no changes to current recommendations to present to Session.

<u>Elizabeth Schweppe</u> presented an update from the Diaconate. Continuing to have success having volunteers sign up to help usher each week.

<u>Drew Mangione</u> discussed results from congregational interest forms that are being provided to committee chairs so that they may consider adding interested members to their committee members.

Fred Blackley, Richard Fletcher, and Drew Mangione provided an update on the January 29 Presbytery Meeting. The major order of business discussed was an overture presented by Grace Covenant church which would amend G-2.0505 by deleting in its entirety G-2.0505b (the "dual ordination prohibition"). Our delegates were not in favor of the overture as presented, however the Bills and Overtures Committee recommended approval of the overture. There was significant discussion both in support and opposed to the overture. In the end, the overture was adopted and will be sent to the General Assembly for affirmative or negative votes, pending concurrence by at least one other Presbytery. Aside from this particular business item, all feedback from the meeting was extremely positive.

Committee Reports

- <u>Property Committee Richard Fletcher</u> discussed a letter and process for completing the transfer of property to the City of Shelby which our congregation approved in January. This item should be on the docket for the Shelby City Council on February 21.
- <u>Discipleship Ministry Committee Cheryl Sisk</u> reported on continued positive Sunday School experiences, upcoming new member class beginning soon, needs in the nursery staff area, the church retreat planning for September 16-18 at Montreat, plans for this year's Ash Wednesday service, and planning for attendance at the Passport Camp.

- <u>Finance Committee Scoot Dixon</u> presented an update of results from January. Finance results are positive through the first month of the year.
- Member Life Fred Blackley discussed the updated structure of the committee and several focus areas they are working to complete. Among those are arranging an event for new members as well as continued focus on Neighborhood Groups. The committee also presented a recommendation to Session to rename the existing Member Care Fund as the Jessi Ogburn Member Care and Education Fund. This recommendation was easily approved by unanimous vote.
- <u>Personnel Committee Darlene Gravett</u> reported on a request to disperse the stipend in the budget for the Bell Choir Leader as that group plans to present music in upcoming services. The committee is also actively engaged in filling the Bookkeeper and Sexton roles as soon as possible. A previous decision affirms that each of these positions are open to church members to apply. Evaluation of salaries for Rainbow staff continues.
- Worship and Music Committee Ben Brooks discussed upcoming plans for Lenten and Easter services for Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday in the sanctuary and Wednesday night programs in Ellis Hall. All were approved by unanimous vote.

Old and New Business

- Ratification of electronic votes since the last in person Session meeting was held for votes that consisted of unanimous approval for:
- Hosting an additional blood drive with the Red Cross on January 27 due to the host church backing out due to COVID concerns.
- The 2021 Statistical Report prior to submission to Presbytery by February 11.
- <u>Funeral Commission Drew Mangione</u> recommended formation of a commission to act on behalf of the Session to approve funeral services in the church with the members being the Pastor and Chairs of the Worship and Member Life Committees. Following discussion, a vote was held with unanimous approval of the commission.

Closing

• Following a request for additional prayer concerns and a motion to adjourn, Darlene Gravett adjourned the meeting with prayer.
