Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Happy Easter! What a joy it has been to walk through Lent with you this year, right on through Holy Week and into this season of Easter. In this season, we are asked to think about what it means to be a new creation, to grow and bear fruit.

While I've had my own struggles gardening, I trust we all have a basic idea of what it takes for a plant to grow from a seed – clear the soil, balanced nutrients, water, and sunlight.

Likewise, faith is often compared to a seed. I'll admit that I have struggled at times to grow that seed of faith, yet, the same principles apply. To grow our faith, we need to clear the soil, balance its nutrients, and add water and sunlight.

Now, God is looking for us to grow in faith, so how do we encourage this in the Easter season?

We need to recognize rocks for what they are – the things that prevent faith from growing deep roots. Rocks in our soil include the excuses for our sins – why I was justified, even when what I did was wrong. Rocks are also things that clutter our time.

Maybe I'm alone on this, but I doubt it. Often the hardest thing to do is admit our mistakes without making excuses. A close second may be to actually slow down. Early in the pandemic, we were forced to, but now that numbers are low, it seems we have wasted no time speeding up.

As hard as it is, when we lay down our excuses, by being honest, and then when we carve out time for God, the rocks get cleared. Similarly, having fun and being productive at work and home can nurture us. Yet with too much focus on our interests, entertainment, work, and hobbies, we grow toward them and away from God.

Growing in faith doesn't mean being dull, lazy, and idle. But it does mean putting things in their place, not letting anything become an idol.

If we continue the garden metaphor, then water is like our relationships with people and our life in community – essential. It is possible to grow in our relationship with God alone, but not likely.

Faith grows best with worship, study, and prayer when bolstered by life in community

Lastly, we must grow toward the light – which is Jesus, God's Word made flesh. We are fed by the Spirit when we spend time in scripture.

Like our garden plants, there are things we can do to better care for and grow the faith God plants in us. Our Lord seeks progress in us – personal growth – and also, seeks progress in our work in this world to reconcile all things in Him.

<u>I believe God has big plans for each of you and</u> <u>for our church the ministry of reconciliation right</u> <u>here in Shelby, in our county, state, and world.</u>

My prayer is that we take the steps to clear away the rocks that get in the way of our faith growing deep and balance even the good things in our life, so that our faith can grow in community and in Christ with enough water and sunlight.

Food Ministry. While the collection of food from Walmart and Second Harvest and its distribution continues, unfortunately, COVID changed how the Food Ministry operated and hot meals ceased. But now, we are preparing to reopen the Soup Lunch and WE NEED YOUR HELP!

WHO: YOU. Here are ways you can be a part...

WHAT: You can help pick up and prepare food by:

1. Food pick up at Walmart (pick-up or SUV truck needed) and sort as needed for distribution/storage 2. Food preparation. This is-not necessarily cooking but also rinsing/opening cans, peeling and cutting up fruits/vegetables, serving on the line, wrapping utensils, washing dishes, clean up (we clean every table, <u>check</u> bathrooms, take out trash, etc.)

WHEN: Every Monday except when the church office is closed. Hours are from generally 8:00 am until approximately 1:00 pm. We are usually finished by 12:30.

HOW: We cannot do this without <u>you and your help</u> whatever that help may be. Either on a weekly basis or perhaps you can give one Monday a month. Maybe you can come the entire morning or perhaps for just a short time? You determine your schedule. Please contact Miranda Wood to let her know your willingness/schedule to serve.

SESSION MEETING NOTES MARCH 15, 2022

Order of the Day – Receiving of New Members

The following were presented and examined for membership: Bethany Bryant, Allen Callahan, Stephanie Ellis-Martin, Debbie Hart, and Beth Phillippi. A motion to accept all new members was presented and accepted with a unanimous vote of approval following. New members were welcomed by extending the right hand of fellowship.

Communications

• John Brotherton had no emergent communication items to present this month.

• Elizabeth Schweppe presented an update from the Diaconate. The next Fellowship activity will be planned as COVID guidelines are eased.

• Drew Mangione reiterated continued excitement for this church and our community. Drew conveyed a recommendation from the Funeral Commission to approve a service for Jessi Ogburn to occur on April 9 in the sanctuary. The recommendation was approved unanimously.

Meeting Minute Approvals

• Meeting minutes from Session Meeting on February 15, 2022 were reviewed and approved unanimously.

Committee Reports

• COVID Task Force – John Brotherton presented updated recommendations from the task force. After much debate on current trends, medical guidance, and varying perspectives, the following was adopted by a majority vote of those present and voting:

1. Masks are recommended, but optional

2. If symptomatic, individuals are encouraged to stay off-site

3. Attendance and seating capacity restrictions are removed

4. Serving of food on-site is allowed at the discretion of the responsible committee

5. These guidelines are open to be revisited if conditions or trends change

• Finance Committee – Scoot Dixon presented an update of results from February. Revenues are slightly under budget so far this year, but expenses have exceeded budget this month. The committee will continue to monitor. A recommendation was also presented to continue with additional audio and video upgrades in the sanctuary to resolve several emerging issues and upgrade some remaining legacy items utilizing funds from the Cornerstone fund. The recommendation was approved unanimously.

• Personnel Committee – Darlene Gravett reported that work continues to fill the Bookkeeper position. Additionally, the committee is pursuing splitting the current job description for the bookkeeper between a bookkeeper position and an office assistant.

Old and New Business

• No new or old business was brought for discussion.
